In addition to working across Leeds City Council as a public health organisation, these roles require excellent relationships and joint working with Leeds Clinical Commissioning Group, other NHS partners, Public Health England, community, and private sector organisations and other key partners, as well as with the people of Leeds.

These demanding, varied and interesting roles require individuals who are highly skilled and experienced across a broad range of public health leadership roles and have a strong track record of delivery, working in collaboration with others.
