letter received from HRMC confirming their UTR number or a screenshot of their online self-assessment account which clearly shows the UTR).

- Not be in receipt of support under the SEISS, ARG-Property Costs, LRSG (Closed) or LRSG (Open).
- Be based in in the retail/hospitality/leisure industries & associated supply chains or be able to demonstrate why their business has been significantly impacted by the Covid 19 pandemic.

Note that in line with government guidance grants must not be used as a wage supplement, rather as a support to the business that the self-employed person runs and this will be made clear to applicants and form part of the self-declaration.

For the avoidance of doubt licensed Taxi drivers and private hire vehicles resident in Leeds along with market traders who have a regular pitch in Leeds that meet the eligibility criteria will qualify for a grant under this scheme.

The scheme will open for applications on Friday 4th December and will remain open for a period of two weeks closing on Friday 18th December.

A brief statement of the reasons for the decision

A Key decision was taken on Thursday 19 November: COVID-19 Local Restrictions Support Grant and Additional Restrictions Grant Schemes including Discretionary Grant Funds

The associated Delegated Decision Note (DDN) stated that: support should be provided for home based businesses / those run from non-domestic premises with annual property costs below £4,000 per annum severely impacted by COVID-19. This DDN related to the details of a Discretionary Grant Scheme (Scheme Two) to support this group of businesses.

It is reported nationally that 1.6m of the self employed have not been able to access the Self Employment Income Support Scheme (SEISS). There are two

principal groups who have been excluded from SEISS support:

- Company Directors those who operate through limited companies and who principally pay themselves through company dividends. Dividends are not eligible to be supported under the SEISS.
- 2. Those who did not declare a significant income as part of their self assessment for 2018/19. This consists of new businesses who either started during or after the 2018/19 tax year. It also would include young businesses who may have established themselves prior to April 2018 but who have declared either no or little income in 2018/19 and those who derive less than 50% of their income through self employment and not eligible for SEISS.

Given the difficulties involved in verifying whether a home based business has accessed SEISS or is incurring significant fixed business costs it is proposed that we focus our first round of support for the self employed on those established less than three years old (those registered for self employment from the 1st January 2018) in sectors which have been badly hit by Covid–19 such as those involved in the retail/hospitality /leisure industries and who via self declaration confirm that they have not been in receipt of SEISS.

This scheme is broadly in line with schemes proposed by other West Yorkshire Authorities.

The proposed scheme has been designed with due regard to both the Government's guidance and the principles of public law and is believed to be fair and reasonable in all respects. A process will operate so that any business which feels that it has not been fairly treated can appeal.

All Covid-19 business support schemes will be reviewed in January 2021 both in terms of grants issued and restrictions in place and further proposals will be brought forwards as appropriate.

Brief details of any alternative options considered and rejected by the decision maker at the time of making the decision

## Alternative options considered were:

 Offer grant support at the above amounts to all home based businesses who declare they have not received SEISS focusing on the Retail Hospitality and Leisure sectors and associated supply chain. This would be

accepting that £500 is a nominal payment to help some of the excluded groups and that we accept that given the potential volumes and lack of financial information it would be impossible to stop fraud. 2. Offer grant support at the above amounts to those in the Retail Hospitality and Leisure sectors/supply chain, disregarding eligibility to SEISS. 3. Offer grant support at the above amounts to all sectors disregarding eligibility to SEISS and focusing on those who can evidence a significant fall income. The scheme as designed is the closest to other West Yorkshire Authorities and links payments to jobs. It seeks to minimise any overlap with SEISS while accepting that young businesses in their first three years of trading often have little in the way of cash reserves to fall back on during difficult trading periods. Options 1 & 2 set out about would widen the potential target audience for grants away from those not eligible for SEISS and those young businesses which have been clearly excluded from mainstream government support. Option 3 was considered potentially very resource heavy at a time when our Economic Development Service is operating at full stretch. Officers therefore recommended that proceeding with a first round as set out above was the best way to proceed.
