	Scheme, in which funding has been allocated to local authorities across			
	England to provide food and fuel support to vulnerable families and individuals			
	between the beginning of December and end of March.			
	This funding was first announced on the 6 th November, and final guidance was			
	received from the DWP on the 24 th November, 2020.			
	The funding asks for provision to be put in place for Christmas, and therefore			
	funding needs to be allocated as soon as possible to enable this to happen.			
	Funding can be provided to third party organisations such as charities and			
	schools.			
	The Director of Children & Families agreed to accept £1.6 million of this			
	funding, which will be allocated to Children & Families, for them to distribute to			
	schools who want to run their own scheme, and to Catering Leeds and Asda to			
	administer a scheme for schools who do not want to run their own scheme.

	 A brief statement of the reasons for the decision (Include any significant financial, procurement, legal or equalities implications, having consulted with Finance, PACS, Legal, HR and Equality colleagues as appropriate) The funding will enable food support to be provided to children who are eligible for FSM, as well as children who are experiencing poverty, over the two weeks of Christmas holiday and February half term. The opt out approach was taken for the following reasons: Some schools have been operating independently since April, and have developed effective practices that are appropriate for their schools. Schools can move quickly to establish this provision based on their preferred delivery method and time is short to enable schools to adopt different methods to that which they know. Schools may feel they are best placed to know their pupils, families and communities, and so can design their scheme to meet their specific need. The autonomy of schools has significantly increased in the last ten years, and therefore a prescribed, one size fits all council approach may not be welcomed The central opt in scheme was created based on recent feedback from some schools, which suggested that a scheme run by Leeds City Council for schools to opt-into will be welcomed given the pressure schools are under at the moment. The data on which children need to receive food provision needs to have been confirmed by the schools by the 4 th December, so the request needs to go out to them no later than the 2nd December 2020.
