The finding of this are highlighted in the Leeds CDI Workspace Research Report on the Leeds city centre and fringe area by CSM 2019 highlighting a gap and further need for this type of opportunity. The proposal will bring into existence a creative 'maker' space and innovation space in Leeds.
