### 2. Please provide a brief description of what you are screening

This screening assessment is considering the authority to extend the Engage Leeds contract for three years; along with approval to accept funding for three Navigator posts and varying the contract to incorporate them.

Engage Leeds is a city wide single service for families and single people operating in localities for up to 1500 clients, providing Housing Related Support. Engage Leeds is a consortium of 4 organisations with Gipsil as the lead organisation Provider.

Engage is outcome focussed and supports people to achieve and sustain independent living. Clients have a primary housing related support need to settle into new

accommodation, sustain existing accommodation or find accommodation. Clients must have a secondary support need impacting on their ability to manage or sustain accommodation including debt, physical or mental health needs, substance misuse, offending or interconnected needs relating to social isolation and community engagement.

The Engage Service contract is a 5 year contract from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2017 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022 with an additional three year extension period up to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2025.

The contract will also include five Navigator posts funded by external funders for up to three years. The Navigators will specifically support vulnerable people and rough sleepers to maintain and sustain accommodation.
