2. Please provide a brief description of what you are screening

Public Health (A & H) , LCC commissions organisations to deliver specific health and wellbeing activity within deprived geographical communities and amongst those groups deemed the most at risk of poor health in Leeds..The aim of the contract it to contribute to reducing the gap in health inequalities by increasing awareness, and reducing barriers to access health and wellbeing services

The current Leeds Cancer Community Awareness Service, is a community based service which aims to reduce cancer inequalities by raising awareness of the signs and symptoms of cancer and promoting and encouraging uptake of cancer screening services. The contract is due to expire on 31st March 2022 and approval is therefore being sought to procure a new service

Through consultation and engagement, it has been recognised that the current contract could be improved by broadening its scope to include prevention and awareness of long term conditions in addition to cancer. The main causes for premature mortality that contribute to health inequalities in Leeds are cancer; CVD and respiratory conditions. Aligning the new contract so it provides a prevention foundation for both cancer and long term conditions therefore supports our ambition for the poorest to improve their health the fastest.

The procurement of a new Leeds Cancer and Long Term Conditions Community Prevention and Awareness Service will mean there will continue to be a service contributing to strategic plans to improve outcomes for communities in some of the most disadvantaged areas of Leeds.

The service is being procured in response to a continued need to address health inequality and improve equity of access to health and wellbeing services. It aims to reduce cancer screening inequalities and inequalities related to other long-term conditions. It will target populations/communities which health data shows are most affected.

The specification will not be prescriptive but will require organisations to reach seldom heard communities. Past contracts have done this by using a Community Health Educator (CHE) approach, recruiting CHE from target communities. Or using volunteers/paid staffs that have experience of working with the relevant populations.

Key findings

Positive impact

This service will contribute towards narrowing the gap in health inequalities by targeting outreach activity in areas of highest deprivation in Leeds and with specific communities where health outcomes are poorer. This includes:

- Adults with Severe Mental Illness
- Men

The service will have a highly visible presence in the community and will develop a range of innovative community outreach approaches to engage with target groups.
