If there was not a crèche the ladies would not be able to attend. The women would not normally access a service like this which is a very positive step. For the past 2 years the ladies have enjoyed the fact they could do their exercise in a safe environment and even more so for those with religious beliefs that can not do exercise on the same building with the opposite sex. To have to pay a lettings fee will mean I would have to increase the charge for the exercise class. I can tell you now the group would have to cease. |
