I wish to object to this application for outside seating on the basis that the noise will increase significantly within this otherwise quiet residential area.

All the activity is inside the café bar at the moment, but the introduction of seating outside is a significant change because people will be congregating outside in the open air, clinking glasses for instance, talking loudly when drinking alcohol, all within close proximity of local residents. Of particular concern is the increase in noise levels this will bring on an evening to a usually quiet road.

Local residents may also find they lose their parking places on an evening to visitors to the café bar and find themselves disturbed by the outside drinkers of the café bar, when going to and from their parked vehicles.

I am writing to formally object to the application by Moustache one of the outcomes of which would be to agree to seating and serving up to 12 customers in the very small space which has been fenced off from the pavement.

My objections are to the intrusive noise that people drinking and eating cannot avoid making if they are to get any enjoyment out of doing so. This part of old Rawdon is actually very quiet in the evening after about 6pm when the shops are closed and the traffic has gone and the residents are entitled to some peace and quiet. There are people living in flats over the shops and residential properties across the road as well as an hotel.

These residents have already had to put up with Turqaz which is on the other side and which seats tables outside. They also,have applied to extend the outside seating I believe.

Another problem is parking which is in very short supply in this area and where a lot of the residential houses do not have drives. Turqaz attracts parking and Moustache increasing its customers seating will do the same.

Finally there is a bus stop which is in regular use right on the corner of this seating space so people queuing will be almost in amongst the diners. Not a good idea.

With all,this in mind I think it should go to a panel for a decision.

Dear Samantha

I understand that Moustache are seeking to alter their licences hours and to be able to seat 12 people outside in the tiny space they have fenced off from the pavement.

I wish to object to this for these reasons.

This area is mixed residential and commercial. People live in the flats over the shops and there are houses opposite as well as a residential hotel across the road.

There is very limited parking, only on the one side of the road and most of the properties haven't drives so parking is at a premium. The restaurant across the road, Turqaz suffers from this parking problem and also contributes to the noise . This is actually a very quiet corner of Rawdon. Once the shops shut there is little in the way of traffic or pedestrian activity so anything like Moustache having a dozen people sitting drinking and, quite rightly, enjoying themselves causes a disturbance for residents.

Please consider this and take the application to a licensing panel.
