<b>Roles and Responsibilities of Community Committee Champions</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• To provide local leadership and champion the agenda at the Community Committee.</li><li>• To represent the Community Committee at relevant meetings, forums and local partnerships.</li><li>• To build links with key services and partners.</li><li>• To provide a link between the Community Committee and the Executive Member to ensure local needs are represented, issues are highlighted, best practice is shared and to facilitate local solutions to any issues.</li><li>• To maintain an overview of local performance.</li><li>• To consult with the Community Committee and represent local views as part of the development and review of policy.</li></ul>
