and sundry essential construction activities.

These works are required prior to the Council entering into the main works contract with Wates, to ensure that there is no delay to the critical path of the programme.

The key benefits of entering into this EWDA is that it will reduce the time Wates will need to be on site and will de-risk any programme delays and utility costs. It will also provide a Covid safe site set up from the start of the main works contract.

The procurement of some materials has been included in the EWDA to protect the Council from rising material costs. This particularly applies to steelwork where market intelligence indicates that prices are subject to a significant increase over the next few months.

The budget for these activites has been included in the cost plan and will reduce the value of the NEC3 ECC.

The implications of not entering into the EWDA are a serious risk of delay to the critical path of the main works programme and an increase in costs due to rising material prices – particulary steelwork.

Brief details of any alternative options considered and rejected by the decision maker at the time of making the decision

The alternative is to undertake the activities during the NEC3 Engineering and Construction contract phase. However, this would risk a delay in the programme resulting in critical paths being missed. Also, the failure to procure raw materials, particulary steelwork as part of this EWDA risks a significant increase in our costs by the time we enter into the main works contract.
