## 2. Please provide a brief description of what you are screening

- In February 2021, Public Health England announced additional grant funding for local authorities for additional medically managed inpatient detoxification. To access the additional funding bids were required from regional or sub-regional consortia of local authorities. Each consortium needed to be have one lead local authority. Leeds City Council has worked with Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council, Calderdale Metropolitan Borough Council and North Yorkshire County Council to form a sub-regional consortium with Leeds City Council being the lead authority.
- Public Health England have awarded a grant of £354,805 to Leeds City Council
  as the lead authority of the consortium to provide additional inpatient

detoxification provision. Leeds City Council will enter into a grant agreement with Humankind, who are commissioned by each of the authorities in the consortium to delivery drug and alcohol services, to manage the inpatient detoxification scheme.

The funding will enable 1,100 additional bed nights to be purchased across the
consortium. These will be allocated to people from each local authority area in
proportion to the funding allocation for that authority area as outlined in the table
above. This process will be managed by Humankind and the consortium
arrangements as a whole will be managed by Leeds City Council.
