- Consultation on the proposals has been undertaken with the Domestic Abuse Voice and Accountability Forum – a group of third sector organisations including those with a specialism in supporting people with protected characteristics.
- A wide-ranging needs assessment relating to domestic violence and abuse is currently underway (includes demographic data, views from service providers and views from victim-survivors of abuse). Findings from this exercise will inform service delivery through these proposals.

• **Key findings**

- The proposals include bringing additional specialist domestic violence support into community-based accommodation, with a particular focus on people who have protected characteristics and are under-represented at seeking support for domestic abuse. The team will include workers from a range of community-based organisations who, in addition to providing case-work, will raise awareness within their communities about domestic violence and the support that is available.
