## Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence
  - a. At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - b. At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. Only individuals licensed by the Security Industry Authority may be used at the premises to guard against:-
  - a. unauthorised access or occupation (e.g. through door supervision), or
  - b. outbreaks of disorder, or
  - c. damage
4. The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -

- a. games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage individuals to -
    - i. drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
    - ii. drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - b. provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - c. provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - d. selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorize anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
  - e. dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
  6. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -

- a. a holographic mark, or
- b. an ultraviolet feature.

7. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 of this condition -

- a. "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- b. "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula  $P = D + (D \times V)$  where -
  - i. P is the permitted price,
  - ii. D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
  - iii. V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- c. "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
  - i. the holder of the premises licence,
  - ii. the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - iii. the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- d. "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- e. "value added tax" mean value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

- (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

8. The responsible person must ensure that -

- a. where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
  - i. beer or cider: ½ pint;

- ii. gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
  - iii. still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- b. these measures are displayed in a menu; price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
  - c. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

### **Embedded Restrictions**

9. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during the hours stated on this licence and:
- On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).
10. The above restrictions do not prohibit:
- a. the taking of the alcohol from the premises, (unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel,) during the first thirty minutes after above hours;
  - b. the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there during the first thirty minutes after the above hours, if the alcohol was supplied for consumption ancillary to those meals.
  - c. consumption of the alcohol on the premises by, or, the taking, sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
  - d. the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of alcohol so ordered;
  - e. the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
  - f. the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces;
  - g. the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
  - h. the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied;
  - i. the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.
11. Where the number of children attending the entertainment exceeds 100 the licensee shall ensure that the provisions of Section 12 of the Children and Young Persons Act 1933 are complied with.

Any other publicly declared holiday - One extra hour.

## **Conditions consistent with the operating schedule relating to the licensing objectives**

### **General – All four licensing objectives**

12. We will always ensure we promote all the licensing objectives to prevent any harm to any persons whilst on our premises.
13. I as the Dps ensure i have a designated Manager or Supervisor in place if i am not on the Premises.

### **The prevention of crime and disorder**

14. The premises have both internal and external CCTV.
15. External lighting of car parks and walk ways.
16. Increased supervision of the trading areas by management, staff and glass collectors.
17. Join a local pubwatch scheme
18. After the 5th working day commencing the day after the request is received, West Yorkshire Police do not respond, then consent will be deemed granted.
19. The applicant must have made no more than 12 such applications relating to either an event of national interest or televised sporting events of national interest in any one calendar year.
20. The non standard hours shall only apply to one hour before and one hour after a televised sporting event of national interest and a maximum of two additional hours in any one day to any other event of national interest.
21. When permission is sought for the sale or supply of alcohol during non standard hours for any Bank Holiday period an event of national interest or a televised sporting event of national interest, then the following will apply:-
22. The applicant must give West Yorkshire Police at least 10 clear working days written notice of any Bank Holiday period or any other event of national interest.
23. Between the hours of 09:00hrs and 11:00hrs every Sunday alcohol can only be sold and consumed ancillary to food.

### **The prevention of public nuisance**

24. Noise shall be inaudible at the nearest noise sensitive premises after 23:00hrs.
25. No external drinking after 23:00hrs.
26. Please leave quietly signs in the premises.

27. Regulated entertainment (excluding recorded music) to end at 23:00hrs.
28. No external regulated entertainment.
29. External background music to be turned off at 21:00hrs.
30. All windows and external doors to be kept shut during live performance save for customer access and egress.
31. We have signs up asking our customers to leave our premises quietly and to respect nearby residents.
32. All our deliveries are delivered in the day time we have no evening deliveries.

### **Public safety**

33. Regular safety checks of the premises including decorative and functional fixtures, floor surfaces and equipment (including electrical appliances) to which the public may come into contact must be undertaken. Records of these safety checks must be kept and made available for inspection by an authorised officer.
34. During opening hours the cellar door must be kept locked or adequately supervised to prevent unauthorised access by the public.
35. If used, any temporary electrical wiring and distributions will be inspected by a suitably qualified and competent person before they are put into use. An inspection record/certificate will be retained for inspection by an authorised officer.
36. Safety glass that is impact resistant or shielded to protect it from impact will be used in all areas where the public may come into contact with it.
37. Members of the public will be prevented from accessing hot food and drink preparation areas to prevent risk of scalds or burns to them.
38. Where strobes, lasers, smoke machines, or any other special effects equipment may be used a written health and safety policy covering all aspects of their use will be provided and staff will be appropriately trained.
39. We do patrol outside areas on a regular basis removing glasses from outside.

### **Protection of children from harm**

40. No Children to be allowed on the premises after 21:00 hours
41. Children to be allowed in the dining area only unless passing from one place to another.
42. Children must be accompanied by an adult if under 16.
43. We will not serve a child we believe is under 18 years of age and encourage the challenge 21.

### **Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority**

#### **The prevention of public nuisance**

44. A facility shall be provided for customers to order taxis and telephone numbers for taxi firms shall be displayed in a prominent location.
