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Civic Estate Fire Risk Prevention Works 2022/23

What is this report about?

Including how it contributes to the city's and council's ambitions

- Leeds City Council has an obligation to comply with statutory fire safety legislation within its buildings so that staff, Members and customers are provided with a safe environment in which to go about their daily business. As a part of this compliance, legislation requires that regular fire risk assessments are undertaken by the employer.
- This report seeks to undertake £2m of fire risk prevention work on the civic estate identified following fire risk assessments to be delivered in 2022/23. The list of buildings where fire prevention works will be undertaken is shown at Appendix 1.
- The completion of this work will support the Council's ambitions of health and wellbeing and safe, strong communities.

Recommendations

That the Director of Resources provides authority to spend £2m of capital fire risk prevention work on the civic estate in 2022/23.

Why is the proposal being put forward?

- 1 Fire safety legislation amalgamated within the Regulatory Reform Order (Fire Safety) 2005 requires the Council to be responsible for the management of fire safety in all civic buildings. One of the significant duties placed upon organisations by the legislation is for fire risk assessments to be undertaken and any remedial work to be identified, prioritised and completed within reasonable timescales.
- 2 The Council ensures that fire risk assessments are carried out in line with Fire Safety Policy and that any risks, improvements or findings are identified and a plan is put in place to action remedial measures and/or rectify defects identified to minimise the risk of individuals being exposed to injury or death from fire.
- 3 The corporate Health and Safety team co-ordinate a rolling programme of fire risk assessments and reviews on an annual basis. During these inspections risks are identified in relation to fire detection, fire alarm systems and monitoring, emergency lighting provision, means of escape that includes compartmentation and fire stopping.
- 4 The proposed £2m programme (Appendix 1) of work in 2022/23 as well as ensuring continued compliance with fire safety legislation will also help in meeting the protocol arrangements agreed both with the Council's insurers (Zurich Municipal) and the Fire Concordat with West Yorkshire Fire and Rescue Service. Completion of the works will also support the Council's ambitions of making Leeds a safer place to live, work and visit.
- 5 Following the fire risk assessments, remedial work is planned on properties forming part of the civic and heritage estate and these works will improve the levels of compartmentation (reducing the spread of fire in the building), protect the means of escape and, where necessary, upgrade fire alarms.

9 The key risk is non-compliance with fire safety legislation, by undertaking the programme of works will ensure that the Council continues to discharge its statutory duties.
