Inner North East Community Committee

Since 3rd December 2021 the Inner North East Community Committee Facebook page has gained: **16 new page 'likes'** (and currently has) **1,157 followers.**

This means that this is the *fourth* most popular Community Committee page.

There are two things to note in general:

- 'reach' is the number of people the post was delivered to
- 'engagement' is the number of reactions, comments or shares

Engagement tends to be a better way of gauging if people are interested and have read the posts because they wouldn't have interacted with it otherwise. For example, a post might reach 1,000 people but if they all scroll past and don't read it, the engagement is 0 and it hasn't been an effective way for the Community Committee to communicate.

Having said that, all posts can be read without any further interaction!!


The most popular post since the 3rd December 2021 the posting regarding Youth Activities Funding:


1st Place - Youth Activities Funding

1, 753 people had this post delivered to them and it had **37** post clicks, with **19** likes, comments and shares.




2nd Place – Arnold Clark – Community Fund

134 people had this post delivered, with **12** post clicks with **0** reactions, comments & shares.



3rd Place – Restaurant Ready Programme 175 people had this post delivered to them. There were **38** post clicks and **4** reactions, comments and shares

The Communities Team have set up **33** ward based **Coronavirus Help Facebook Groups** as a way of promoting services, supporting communities and cascading information in an attempt to tackle the Coronavirus pandemic.
