Section 33 of the Act provides that the authority (in the case of Leeds this function is delegated by Full Council to the Chief Executive) may, on written request, grant a dispensation relieving the Member from either or both of the restrictions imposed by Section 31. The dispensation, which must be granted for a specific period not exceeding four years, may be granted on any of the following grounds:-

- Without the dispensation the number of persons prohibited from participating in any particular business would so great as to impede the transaction of the business;
- 2. Without the dispensation the representation of different political groups would be so upset as to alter the likely outcome of any vote;
- 3. The dispensation is in the interests of persons living in the authority's area;
- Without the dispensation each Member of the executive would be prohibited from participating in business to be transacted by the executive; or
- 5. It is otherwise appropriate to grant a dispensation.

## **Taxable Allowances**

In the absence of a dispensation in relation to Allowances Members would not be able to vote on the Members' Allowances Scheme thus impeding the transaction of the Council's business. Neither would Members be able to vote on appointments to internal or external positions to which they were nominated.

The Monitoring Officer therefore recommends that the Chief Executive grants dispensations to all those Members listed in Scendule 1 as having requested a dispensation in relation to Allowances for a period of four years.

## **Regulatory Matters**

The prohibition on Members involvement in decision making where they have a disclosable pecuniary interest prevents their participation under any circumstances. This would include circumstances where any other Member of the public would have the right to attend a committee in order to make representations for example in relation to a planning application which they are making or to which they wish to object, or in relation to a licensing matter. The Monitoring Officer therefore recommends that the Chief Executive grants dispensations to all those Members listed in Appendix A as having requested a dispensation in relation to Regulatory Matters for a period of four years
