Recorded CCTV surveillance cameras cover both internal & external parts of the club building as well as the pavilion All public areas of the inside of the building are covered except the toilets. Where external cameras are sighted there is sufficient outside lighting for the cameras to be of use.

The capability to turn on the members swipe card door entry sytem as and when nessesary to prevent unwanted/unauthorised entry. There is a cctv camera at the enterance door and this is transmitted to a screen behind the games room bar above the till that can be viewed by both employees & customers alike.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The club constitution includes rules regarding the conduct of both members & guests both within, and adjacent to all the club premises. All club employees are instructed not to admit or serve members or guests who behave in a drunk or disorderly manner.

c) Public safety

Health & safety and fire precautions regulations are complied with. Preventative & control measures are in place to ensure the safety of members, guests, employees and entertainers whilst on the premises. The club complies with capacity limits and emergency exit points are signposted.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Whilst all live or recorded music is played all reasonable steps are taken to avoid disturbance to neighbouring properties. Notices are displayed on our internal tv system stating this as well as noitces outside our premises

e) The protection of children from harm

Persons under the age of 18 are only allowed in the club when accompanied by a parent or guardian. The parent or guardian is responsible for the minor and they must stay with them & supervise them for the duration of their stay. Junior members (aged 15 and above) are only allowed in the club unaccompanied when playing snooker. These individuals have been vetted for approval before this permission is granted. The club steward & his staff have been instructed regarding in the offence provisions of the licencing act 2003 relating to alcohol and the protection of children.

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NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

In terms of specific **regulated entertainments** please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience
 does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
 wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
 exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
 wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
 indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

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PAYMENT DETAILS

This fee must be paid to the authority. If you complete the application online, you must pay it by debit or credit card.

The variation fee is based on the non domestic rateable value of the premises these fees are:

Non domestic rateable value £4,300 or less - £100

Non domestic rateable value between £4,301 and £33,000 - £190

Non domestic rateable value between £33,001 and £87,000 - £315

Non domestic rateable value between £87,001 and £125,000 - £450

Non domestic rateable value £125,001 or more - £635

If the premise non domestic rateable value is £87,001 or more and the premises is used exclusively or primarily for the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises the fee for this application is:

Non domestic rateable value between £87,001 and £125,000 - £900

Non domestic rateable value £125,001 or more - £1,905
