A brief statement of the reasons for the decision

Leeds City Council has an ambition to deliver a safe and coherent network of cycling and walking infrastructure across the city, to help encourage sustainable active travel in line with the priorities of the Best Council Plan 2020-2025. As part of Leeds City Council's successful Transforming Cities Fund bid a package of 6 projects has been developed to provide cycling and walking infrastructure around the city centre to link many of its recent high-quality projects together to form an accessible and coherent network to facilitate active travel around the city. This was approved at Executive Board in June 2021 These projects will encourage safe and sustainable travel in line with the ambitions and priorities of the city and remove barriers to cycling as a choice for short and medium length journey.

Brief details of any alternative options considered and rejected by the decision maker at the time of making the decision

As part of the design process, several different considerations and layouts were considered, particularly at signalised junctions, to ensure the safety, efficiency, and cost effectiveness of what is being delivered. The layouts that have been chosen to reflect the balance between these three factors, with providing high-quality and direct cycling infrastructure being paramount within the design.

The other option would be to not deliver this project and leave the area as it is currently. This would not deliver the benefits that are outlined within this report and would leave gaps between other pieces of cycling infrastructure in key strategic locations on approach to the City Centre.
