Hello Mr. Elliot,

Thanks for your email reply, which is perfectly clear and what I was expecting to be honest.

So, on the basis of your reply and your variation application itself, I would now ask you to-

- 1. consider the following **amendment** to your application, and also
- 2. agree to other **conditions** being <u>added</u> to your licence on the variation of it.

Firstly regards the amendment , and specifically the □hours premises are open to the public□, West Yorkshire Police would say these hours should be amended from Mon to Sat 1000-0600 & Sunday 1200-0600 as applied for, to Mon to Sat 1000-0000 & Sunday 1200-0000 .
The reason being, at section 3 of your variation application form, you have said and I quote-
\square Just to clarify from 12:00 am the Restaurant will close to the public and only open to customers using the uber eats and Deliveroo platforms. (no collection option will be available to customers. Only delivery). We will be offering delivery from 12PM \square
Therefore, if □no collection□ is to be made available after 0000 (12:00am), then the premises does not need to be open to the public after 0000, but the delivery of products can still take place from the premises after 0000 until 0600.
On the basis of the details you have provided in your application, West Yorkshire Police would now ask you to consider amending it as suggested above and for the reasons given, by contacting Leeds City Council direct yourself.
Secondly, in relation to the conditions of your premises licence, you have clearly indicated, all the existing conditions of your licence are to be maintained \square (section 15 of the variation application form).
(Incidentally, the existing conditions in relation to CCTV require image retention for 31 days \square see condition 19 \square and not 30 days as you state in this variation application \square section 16c. By your indication to maintain ALL existing conditions 31 days will still apply therefore).
But, in light of your variation application, West Yorkshire Police would now ask you to agree to several <u>additional</u> conditions being added to your licence, relevant to the changes you propose and with a view to promoting the licensing objectives.
