	The variation of hackney carriage fares and charges is subject to a strict statutory					
	process, whereby the proposals are advertised with a minimum consultation period					
	of 2 weeks. The Council advertised the proposals on 2 December 2022 and received 119 responses to the consultation, including 26 objections, by the closing date of 16 December 2022. The Council has taken account of the objections					
	received in the consultation, and now seeks to implement the new fares.
