Email 3 Concerns about the Capri Group and poor application process from Capri Roundhay

I have some of concerns regarding Capri Roundhay being granted an alcohol license.

There have been of number of inconsistencies in their application proving little to no knowledge of the premises, location and surrounding area:

On the first application, the wrong information was entered onto the alcohol licensing document and this led to the application being wiped, along with public comments: In the conditions they included a beer garden (there is no outside space), outside music (again, no outside space), and irresponsible seating covers? It appeared that they had copied and pasted parts of the conditions from other Capri Group applications without considering these premises and certainly not proof-reading to ensure the application was correct.

Capri Roundhay put up a notice giving residents and local businesses in the area 2 weeks notice to raise their concerns this was done in error as the application was not live (see attachment 3)

In this application, live music was added. According to Janice Archibald the application does not need to explicitly include live music as it is implied in an alcohol license another error on the application.

When the application was available to comment on, residents commented and raised their concerns, but due to the above inconsistencies in the application, it was wiped out and was started again □ which led to all the public comments being removed.

On the second application, there were issues with the timings of the notices which led to the application being wiped, along with public comments:

They did not put the notice in the paper within the mandatory 10 working days □ it was added 3 days after this date (see attachment 1) □ so the application was wiped and started again.

In the meantime, residents had started adding comments, and again all the public comments were removed from the application.

On the third application, failure to remove the notice for the second application led to the public being misled about the closing date:

A new notice was added into Leeds Licensing (see attachment 2) but the notice for the second application was not removed. Instead, of updating the original notice it was left in the paper and the new notice was added into a different paper.

This misled the local community (who hadn't seen the notice on the shutter of the shop) into thinking that the original closing date from the second application was in fact the closing date for the third application. Leading the local community to believe it was too late to comment as the closing date had □passed□.

With an alcohol license comes a high level of responsibility. The above actions with repeated mistakes, misleading information and, more worryingly, misleading the public - can not be considered responsible behaviour. What is more concerning is the way in which the applications □ and public comments have been removed each time. Which leads me to think they have no consideration for the local residents.

I understand, with a new license it could be daunting and may not be done right the first time □ but they are a group of restaurants who have applied for many licenses in the past (as can be seen by the copying and pasting incident). So, there should have been a level of due diligence done to ensure the conditions specified in the application are correct and in line with the actual premises the alcohol license is being applied for.

I would also like to add that the Capri Group have been considered to have a bad reputation for upholding the peace with their patrons who are under the influence, with little respect for the local residents. This is very concerning for a quiet residential area, with mainly families and elderly people (see attachments 4&5). With this behaviour and the above mistakes, I hope you can understand why I feel so concerned about Capri Roundhay being granted an alcohol license.

Please can you ensure my concerns are raised at the hearing, and if possible, let me know the outcome.

He added: "CCTV secured by officers identified in excess of 20 persons present in the beer garden area purchasing and consuming draught beer, using the premises facilities, dancing and partying in close proximity to each other, with children present throughout most of the incident.

"Capri staff are captured giving out pizza boxes to customers.

"Police believe these to have been empty in an attempt to deceive the officer."

PC Kaye said the incident showed, "The owner and staff have carried out a blatant contravention" of lockdown restrictions, which were still in place at that time.
