A brief statement of the reasons for the decision

- 1. Section 278 of the Highways Act 1980 allows Highways Authorities to enter into agreements with developers for the execution of highway works at the developer's expense. The preconditions for an agreement under Section 278 of the Highways Act 1980 are, first, that the Highway Authority should be satisfied that it will be of benefit to the public to enter into an agreement for the execution of the works and, secondly, that the work must fall within the Highway Authority's powers of road building, improvement and maintenance.
- 2. The proposals within this report are concerned only with the delivery of the off-site highway works, the principle of these works having been considered and accepted as part of the planning process for planning consent 21/06951/FU. The location of the development site is provided on LRCE/DLA/ZZ/00/DR/L90111 P03 at Appendix 2 of the Design and Cost Report. A General Arrangement Plan (drawing ref: 1135/LCC/23/XX/DR/TM/01/01A) is provided at Appendix 3 of the Design and Cost report.
- 3. Planning permission was granted in February 2022 (ref: 21/06951/FU) for construction of a secondary school with associated MUGA, landscaping access, fencing, parking and drainage works and associated highway improvements at Ring Road. The planning consent requires a package of

- highway improvements described in detail in paragraph 4 below.
- 4. The highway works are required to ensure pedestrian and cycling movements associated with the development are accommodated safely. The proposed works comprise:
- Provision of a new toucan crossing on Ring Road to the west of the Site/Middleton Leisure Centre access road.
- Removal of existing pedestrian refuge island to facilitate new toucan crossing.
- Grass verge removal along the southern side of Ring Road to provide footway/cycleway construction and facilitate access to the proposed toucan crossing.
- Removal of existing bus stop and shelter located on the northern side of Ring Road to the east of Middleton Park Road.
- Relocation of the aforesaid bus stop with new shelter and bus lay-by to the west of the proposed toucan crossing.
- Construction of new shared footway/cycleway from the relocated bus stop up to the toucan crossing.
- Widening of existing footways leading from the toucan crossing to the north and east of Middleton Park Road to provide shared footway/cycleway.
- Improvement of existing Informal pedestrian crossing on Middleton Park Road with dropped kerbs and tactile paving on both sides.
- Retention of existing bus stop with shelter located on the southern carriageway of Ring Road.
- Associated road markings and TROs.
- All associated Civils works, including (inter alia) reconstruction, tie-ins, resurfacing, signing, lighting, drainage and lining works etc;
- Any works reasonably required following safety audits of the design and construction of the highway works; and
- Any associated statutory undertaker's work resulting from the Works.
- To meet the requirements of the planning permission and deliver the highway improvements outlined above the developer seeks to enter into a Section 278 Agreement (Highways Act 1980) to enable the highways works to be carried out.
- This report seeks authority to negotiate terms and enter into a S278
 Agreement for the highway works associated with the development to allow the Council to design and construct the works at the developer's expense.
