## Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

1. Only individuals licensed by the Security Industry Authority may be used at the premises to guard against:-
  - a. unauthorised access or occupation (e.g. through door supervision), or
  - b. outbreaks of disorder, or
  - c. damage
2. No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence
  - a. At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - b. At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4. The admission of children under the age of 18 to film exhibitions permitted under the terms of this licence shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendations made
  - a. By the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC,) where the film has been classified by the Board, or
  - b. By the Licensing Authority where no classification certificate has been granted by the BBFC, or,
  - c. where the licensing authority has notified the licence holder that section 20 (3) (b) (74 (3) (b) for clubs) of the Licensing Act 2003 applies to the film.
5. The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -

- a. games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage individuals to -
  - i. drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
  - ii. drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- b. provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- c. provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- d. selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or

glamorize anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

- e. dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

6. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

7. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -

- a. a holographic mark, or
- b. an ultraviolet feature.

8. The responsible person must ensure that -

- a. where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:

- i. beer or cider: ½ pint;
- ii. gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- iii. still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

- b. these measures are displayed in a menu; price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- c. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

9. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 of this condition -

- a. "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- b. "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula  $P = D + (D \times V)$  where -
  - i. P is the permitted price,
  - ii. D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
  - iii. V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- c. "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
  - i. the holder of the premises licence,
  - ii. the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - iii. the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

- d. "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- e. "value added tax" mean value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

- 1. Sub-paragraph 2 applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
  - 2. The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
10. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during the hours stated on this licence and:
- a. On Christmas Day, 12 noon to 3 p.m. and 7 p.m. to 10.30 p.m.
  - b. On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).
11. The above restrictions do not prohibit:
- a. the taking of the alcohol from the premises, (unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel,) during the first thirty minutes after above hours;
  - b. the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there during the first thirty minutes after the above hours, if the alcohol was supplied for consumption ancillary to those meals.
  - c. consumption of the alcohol on the premises by, or, the taking, sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
  - d. the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of alcohol so ordered;
  - e. the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
  - f. the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces;
  - g. the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
  - h. the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied;
  - i. the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

12. Where the number of children attending the entertainment exceeds 100 the licensee shall ensure that the provisions of Section 12 of the Children and Young Persons Act 1933 are complied with.

## **Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule**

### **Additional details in respect of licensable activities authorised by this licence**

#### Sale by retail of alcohol

- Non standard timings:
- One additional hour on Bank Holiday weekends (Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday) and Christmas Eve and Boxing Day.
- One additional hour on 12 other event days at the licensee's discretion.

### **Conditions consistent with the operating schedule relating to the licensing objectives**

#### **The prevention of crime and disorder**

13. Discourage criminal conduct in particular the use of illegal substances by displaying notices in and at entrances to the premises which clearly state that:  
  
"entry will be refused to any person who is drunk, threatening or violent, entry may be refused to any person who has been convicted of an offence of drunkenness, violent or threatening behaviour or the use or distribution of illegal substances at a licensed venue, evidence may be recorded on imaging equipment or CCTV and offences will be reported to the police"
14. Become a member of a Licensees Association (Pub watch) or other licensees representative body one of whose principle aims is to reduce crime, disorder and anti-social behaviour in partnership with other agencies.
15. Install an efficient and effective CCTV system in accordance with guidance issued by and acceptable to the West Yorkshire Police.
16. Operating hours specified in the licence will be utilised as often as possible so as not to undermine the policing plan for the district or the crime prevention objective.
17. Adopt an appropriate proof of age scheme in accordance with guidance issued by West Yorkshire Police and trading standards.

#### **The prevention of public nuisance**

18. Noise will be inaudible at the nearest noise sensitive premises after 23:00 hours and when entertainment takes place on a regular basis at all times.
19. Bottles will not be placed in the external receptacle after 23.00 hours to minimise noise disturbance to adjoining properties.
20. The rating level of noise from plant and machinery will be no higher than 5dB below the lowest background level at the most affected noise sensitive premises during the operation of the plant. Plant and machinery will be regularly serviced and maintained to continue to meet the rating level.
21. There will be no external loudspeakers.
22. Patrons shall not be allowed to use beer gardens or any external areas after 23:00hrs.

23. Exterior area checked for bottles/glassware throughout the trading sessions.
24. Clear and legible notices will be displayed at exits, car parks and other circulatory areas requesting patrons to leave the premises having regard to the needs of local residents, in particular emphasising the need to refrain from shouting, slamming car doors, sounding horns and loud use of vehicle stereos and anti-social behaviour. The activity of persons leaving the premises shall be monitored and they shall be reminded to leave quietly where necessary.

### **Public safety**

25. Before opening to the public, checks will be undertaken to ensure all access to the premises are clear for emergency vehicles. Regular checks will be undertaken when the premises is open.
26. Written records of all accidents and safety incidents involving members of the public will be kept. These will be made available at the request of an authorised officer.
27. Fire alarm and extinguishers checked regularly and results recorded.
28. Regular safety checks of the premises including decorative and functional fixtures, floor surfaces and equipment (including electrical appliances) to which the public may come into contact, must be undertaken. Records of these safety checks must be kept and made available for inspection by an authorised officer.
29. During opening hours the cellar door must be kept locked or adequately supervised to prevent unauthorised access by the public.
30. Empty bottles and glasses will be collected regularly paying particular attention to balcony areas and raised levels.
31. Electrical installations will be inspected on a periodic basis (at least every 3 years) by a suitably qualified and competent person. Inspection records/certificates will be kept. These will be made available at the request of an authorised officer.
32. All floor surfaces will be suitably slip resistant, kept in good condition and free of obstructions to prevent slips, trips and falls.
33. Members of the public will be prevented from accessing hot food and drink preparation areas to prevent risk of scalds or burns to them.
34. Suitably trained First Aider or appointed person will be provided at all times when the premises are open.
35. Adequate and appropriate First Aid equipment and materials will be available on the premises.
36. Function room bookings limited to 70 persons.
