The Safer Leeds Performance and Intelligence Team (including Police and LCC analytical staff) support the ongoing work reviewing local, regional, and national data and trends on a regular basis and reporting updates to the SLE. Reporting is presented around 3 core categories, encompassing all 9 priority areas. The table below summarises the measures monitored and current performance trends:
