

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The Lifelong Learning Centre

- The Lifelong Learning Centre is a multi-disciplinary School offering undergraduat courses, and a specialist service supporting mature and part-time learners acros University of Leeds.
 - Our courses encourage and support student diversity, focusing on students from under-represented groups/those without traditional qualifications.

We support current and prospective mature, part-time and Foundation level students, and apprentices.

The Communities and Partnerships team works with community organisations a education providers in areas of low participation in HE in Leeds and West Yorksh create opportunities for adults to access HE.

Community engagement aims: widen opportunities for adults to access higher education & make informed choices

JumpStart is a short, free course

aimed at adult learners who are thinking about whether university might be an option for them.

- Meet other adult learners with similar interests
- Discuss your options with tutors
- Make an informed decision about Higher Education

SCHEDULE

JumpStart is run on **Wednesday evenings** from **5:00pm - 7:00pm** for the duration of **8 weeks**. There are **2** additional Saturday sessions within this 8 weeks, making it **10 sessions** in total.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

We usually expect students to be working towards or have achieved GCSE English and Maths at grade C/4 or above. We also greatly value life skills and experience and expect learners to show their commitment to the course as places are limited.

WHAT COULD I DO NEXT?

Progression from JumpStart will depend on meeting specific entry requirements for particular courses. Providing that you successfully complete this programme and meet these entry requirements, you may be able to move onto foundation year study in higher education.
