Leeds City Council has an ambition to deliver a safe and coherent network of cycling and walking infrastructure across the city, to help encourage sustainable active travel in line with the priorities of the Best Council Plan 2020-2025. As part of Leeds City Council's successful Active Travel Fund bid a package of measures along the A660 corridor has been developed to provide safer and improved segregates cycling and walking infrastructure to form an accessible and coherent network to facilitate active travel along the A660 corridor. This project will encourage safe and sustainable travel in line with the ambitions and priorities of the city and remove barriers to cycling as a choice for short and medium length journey.

Brief details of any alternative options considered and rejected by the decision maker at the time of making the decision

As part of the design process, several different considerations and layouts were considered and discussed with Active Travel England, particularly at signalised junctions, to ensure the safety, efficiency, and cost effectiveness of what is being delivered. The layouts that have been chosen to reflect the balance between these three factors, with providing high-quality and direct cycling infrastructure being paramount within the design.

The other options would be to deliver a scheme not in accordance with LTN 1/20 or not to deliver this project at all and leave the area as it is currently. This would not

	deliver the benefits that are outlined within this report and would leave gaps between other pieces of cycling infrastructure along this corridor.
