- By preventing parking to all in the carriageway clearway, there is a detrimental impact upon those with reduced mobility, as they would not be able to park close to the River Wharfe and Arthington Viaduct as previous. Whilst more able-bodied individuals can walk the further distance, those with reduced mobility would not.

The extents of the carriageway clearway have been carefully selected to ensure it is only in place where the carriageway narrows beyond a point where parking can legitimately take place. Other areas are left clear, or with no waiting at any time.
