

The Lifelong Learning Centre

- The Lifelong Learning Centre is a multi-disciplinary School offering undergraduate courses, and a specialist service supporting mature and part-time learners across the University of Leeds.
- Our courses encourage and support student diversity, focusing on students from under-represented groups/those without traditional qualifications.
- We support current and prospective mature, part-time and Foundation level students, and apprentices.
- The Communities and Partnerships team works with community organisations and education providers in areas of low participation in HE in Leeds and West Yorkshire, to create opportunities for adults to access HE.

Community engagement aims: widen opportunities for adults to access higher education & make informed choices

What we do:

- Offer positive messages about the benefits of further and higher education
- Bust myths around higher education for adults e.g. finance, entry qualifications
- Provide role models for adults from under-represented groups in HE
- Impartial information advice and guidance for adults without degrees

 Community engagement approach: long term & sustainable, aiming to support the communities we work with

Areas of low participation in Leeds and Wakefield

Key Messages for adults

- You can go to university at any age/stage in your life
- Universities and colleges welcome adult students from diverse and backgrounds
- Life experience counts
- No 'standard' route for an adult to get into higher education; depends on individual experience and qualifications
- Finding out about the finance is crucial



Community-engaged learning through negotiated outreach



- Negotiated taster sessions on topic useful & relevant to group.
- Talks to workers on pathways into HE for adults.
- Visits to the university made accessible through help with travel, include lunch & childcare support where possible.
- Support community/adult learning organisations where possible through university volunteers & research

- Help towards travel costs and learning support
