Lily was adopted as the Hevesh family found out about the Chinese policy in the past of only having one child and their preference for a boy child, no discriminatory language was used, they were just talking about the Chinese policy that was discriminatory to girls where parents had more than one child. Some hate comments are shown that people have written on her YouTube channel for example, "she is Asian, unsubscribed"
