On Wednesday 30th August 2023 I was working 0700x1600 duty wearing uniform. I was assisting with a day of action organised by A/PS ELLIS targeting several business premises on HAREHILLS ROAD in LEEDS who were suspected to be involved in Organised Crime. Several partner agencies were also present.

One of the businesses targeted was BK STORES, 78 HAREHILLS ROAD, LS85NU. I was asked to attend at the premises to assist another officer who had 2 suspects detained following the discovery of a large quantity of suspected stolen goods.

I attended and met with A/PS ELLIS who escorted me to the cellar area of the shop where there were shelves full of various types of alcohol as well as different perfumes. This was located tucked away at the very rear of the cellar.

There were around 120x bottles of Jack Daniels along with numerous boxes of Zara and Next perfumes and aftershaves all in the original packaging. As far as I could see none of these fragrances were on visible display upstairs in the shop for sale to customers. This further led to me thinking the goods were stolen.

The store was a fairly large convenience store. As you walked through the front door there were shelves to the left and to the right. The till was to the right hand-side as you walked in. There was a small wooden door at the back right of the shop which lead to a staircase that lad to the cellar.

There was a wooden door which was padlocked in the cellar, this then lead into another room which had another wooden door at the back of the room which was also padlocked.

Within the second padlocked room there was a large amount of property that appeared to be stolen. I suspected the items to be stolen due to them being branded items such as PRIMARK, NEXT, and ALDI. Most items were in bags for life and looked as if shoplifters were bringing stolen items and the shop owner was buying the items from them and storing them in the locked room.

There were large quantities of washing powder, coffee, and shampoo. There was an extremely large amount of Jack Daniels, approximately 250 bottles.

Based on this suspicion At 12:35hrs I arrested the and MASOOD on suspicion of handling stolen goods. I applied handcuffs in the front stacked position to MASOOD and double locked them for safety. Neither made no significant reply.

The Licensing Act 2003 outlines four objectives that are to be upheld, the Home Office (Immigration Enforcement) is concerned regarding the prevention of crime and disorder.

Home Office (Immigration Enforcement) considers that Aamir MASOOD is not taking suitable measures to prevent crime and disorder. The business has employed illegal workers which is prohibited under the Licensing Act 2003 and the Immigration Act 1971 (as amended).

Employing illegal workers in the UK has the following impact on the community and society as a whole: -

- It deprives HMRC and the Government of revenue by non-payment of tax and national insurance.
- It exploits the undocumented by paying them less than the minimum wage and provides no employment or income protection.
- It encourages those without permission to work to seek similar employment.
- It allows a business to unfairly undercut other businesses by employing cheap labor.
- Illegal workers are often housed in cramped and unsatisfactory conditions by the employer as part of their working arrangement.

Immigration Enforcement supports **Police Licensing** in bringing this review application for the above premises.

On 10 November 2022, Immigration Officers from Yorkshire & Humberside ICE team conducted a visit to BK STORES, 78 HAREHILLS ROAD, LEEDS LS8 5NU. Entry was gained under section 179 of the Licensing Act 2003.

Immigration Officers encountered the following illegal workers:

entered the UK on a student visa in 2010. He had permission to work 10 hours per week term time. His leave and right to work expired in 2011. He has not made any attempts to regularise his stay in the United Kingdom and had no permission to work at the time of the enforcement visit. He was arrested for breaching his bail conditions.

entered the UK as a visitor and did not have permission to work in the United Kingdom. His visa expired on 09/11/2021. He has not made any attempts to regularise his stay in the UK. He does not have permission to work in the UK.

A Civil Penalty Referral Notice was served to Aamir MASOOD and this is currently being considered by the Civil Penalties Compliance Team.

Whether by negligence or wilful blindness an illegal worker was engaged in activity on the premises, yet it is a simple process for an employer to ascertain what documents they should check before a person can work. All employers are dutybound by law to conduct these checks if they wish to avoid being penalised if found to have employed someone who is prohibited from working, and guidance can be found on the Gov.UK website or by using a search engine. Additional information on how to conduct these checks is available online, this includes the Home Office's official YouTube page.

It is an offence to work when a person is disqualified to do so, and such an offence can only be committed with the co-operation of a premises licence holder or its agents. It is also an offence to employ an illegal worker where there is reason to believe this is the case.

Section 182 guidance of the Licensing Act 2003 at point 11.27 states that certain activity should be treated particularly seriously, and this includes employing someone who is disqualified from that work by reason of their immigration status in the UK. 11.28 of the guidance states that it is expected that revocation of the licence – even in the first instance – should be seriously considered.
