The purpose of this report is to seek approval for an extension of the contract with Community Links (Northern) Ltd for the Maltings and Rose Villa contract for a 12-month period in accordance with Contracts Procedure Rule (CPR) 21.2.

Both services are commissioned by Adults and Health directorate to provide support to people with mental health issues, in accommodation at The Maltings, and with a combination of some accommodation and visiting support at Rose Villa.

These services were put on an interim 12+12 month contract from 1st April 2023, the current contract period expires on 31st March 2024. They have been part of an ongoing strategic review into a number of commissioned services which provide support to

people with mental health issues.

This review has been undertaken in partnership with officers within the West Yorkshire Integrated Commissioning Board (ICB) who are responsible for commissioning and managing some of the services in scope of the review.

The Maltings and Rose Villa are contract managed by Adults and Health directorate, they are considered good value and deliver high quality support and outcomes for people living in the services.

Community Links are an established and experienced service provider and are working closely with officers within the Council and ICB as part of the strategic review to identify ways of remodelling services to meet future needs. It is expected this work will continue in 2024 with a target of new longer-term contracts to be established from 1st April 2025
