e) The Director of Communities, Housing and Environment approved an award of up to £48,917 for 2024-25 as a grant to Barca-Leeds for Navigator support for the LCC Purchase and Repair/Conversion Programme (RSAP Round 5) The grants fund a number of Navigator posts and interventions with different organisations to support people rough sleeping. A brief statement of the reasons for the decision (Include any significant financial, procurement, legal or equalities implications, having consulted with Finance, PACS, Legal, HR and Equality colleagues as appropriate) The grant funding directly contributes to the Best Council Plan's overarching vision of tackling poverty and reducing inequalities. It addresses the Best Council Plan's priority of keeping people safe from harm, protecting the most vulnerable, minimising homelessness and reducing health inequalities. 1.2 RSAP has been used for a number of years to provide an annual grant to LCC to enable specialist support and accommodation to be provided for people who are homeless and/or rough sleeping. The organisations to be allocated grant funding are considered the best placed to meet these clients' needs and have been involved in bidding for the RSAP funds and in the Street Support Partnership.
