A brief statement of the reasons for the decision

The housing developers of Temple Point, Bullerthorpe Lane (Strata Homes Ltd) have paid the Local Authority Section 106 education contributions totalling £258,919.47 to be used towards the provision of and/or improvement of primary educational facilities within Temple Newsam ward required as a consequence of the development.

Colton Primary School (PS) is the closest primary school to families living in the Temple Point, Bullerthorpe Lane housing development at 0.39 miles (straight line distance). Colton PS is also located within the Temple Newsam ward.

Colton PS has absorbed most of the additional demand for primary school places generated by this development. At October 2022 census, 39 primary aged pupils were living in the housing development, 25 of whom were attending Colton PS.

Colton PS will continue to provide a long-term solution to meet the housing generated demand from this development. Therefore, it is appropriate for the S106 primary education contributions, paid by the developers of this site, to be directed towards meeting the capital cost of improvement works at the school.

Colton PS has proposed a scheme to replace an existing temporary building used for wrap-around childcare improving the facilities offered to families and increasing the number of places offered. The new space would also be used throughout the school day enabling groups of pupils to have a dedicated breakout workspace and offering a better location for learning such as an area for instrumental tuition.

At January 2024's Good Learning Places Board, support was given to allocate £258,919.47 of Section 106 education contributions, paid to the Local Authority by Strata Homes Ltd, against school improvement works at Colton Primary School.

Brief details of any alternative options considered and rejected by the decision maker at the time of making the decision

Colton Primary School is the closest primary school to the Temple Point, Bullerthorpe Lane housing development and is popular with the families living there. It is also located within the Temple Newsam ward. There are no other suitable options available that would meet the conditions of the Section 106 agreement in question.

Allocating the S106 education funding to school improvement works at Colton Primary School will ensure places remain available to meet future demand from this development. Therefore, providing Colton Primary School with this funding is a good value for money option.
