Re: PREM/01365/005 - Go Local (with Gulf Petrol Station)

I am writing on behalf of the Trustees of the Charity of Hargill Walker regarding the above application by Go Local to extend the hours for the sale of alcohol and in the provision of late night refreshments. The extension and variation of the current restrictions will enable the owners of the applicant's premises at Harrogate Road, Yeadon to sell alcohol and hot food and drinks, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week in an area where the vast majority of the neighbouring properties are residential.

The Charity was established by a local resident in 1923 to provide Almshouses for local persons in need.

The Trustees have serious concerns both regarding the application to allow the sale

of alcohol throughout the night and also the application to change the use of the premises to a hot food and drinks take-away, with the possibility of a night service hatch.

The Trustees are particularly worried that approval of the application will lead to the car park belonging to the Charity being used by the applicant's customers as a convenient place to congregate and socialise for the consumption of alcohol and hot food, with resultant littering and anti-social behaviour, particularly as the car park will be unlit, whereas the convenience store and forecourt will be fully lit and have CCTV. Naturally, this would be most alarming and extremely distressing for the residents of the

The Trustees have a legal obligation under their charitable status to protect the interests of their residents and provide them with a safe and secure area to live. The Trustees feel most vehemently that this application will have a detrimental affect on the residents' well being and mental health and will cause them considerable concern and distress, which is the exact opposite of the Charity's aims and objectives

Many large supermarkets are open 24 hours, if people need to shop out of hours.

The serving of alcohol 24 hours in a built up residential area is wrong, it encourages anti social behavior, drink driving, noise and littering. We already have youths loitering around drinking, this would just exasperate the situation.

I feel any staff working here at these times would be very vulnerable, with regards to crime and intimidation. Morally we should all be trying to encourage people to drink in moderation at socially acceptable times of day, to keep people from being a strain on the NHS.

I am writing in objection to an application to extend opening hours and alcohol sales to 24 hours from the Go Local filling station and retail shop at the junction of Windmill Lane/ Green Lane and Harrogate Road in Rawdon/Yeadon. These premises are about from my property and even closer to my neighbours.

These are the only retail or business premises in an otherwise residential neighbourhood and up to now have opened daily from 8am to 10pm, something we have learned to live with for the last 40 odd years.

Now, to open 24 hours as the only outlet for alcohol and cigarettes and food for quite some distance around is asking for trouble . It will attract not only local youth but the all night traffic from the airport and taxi drivers between fares.

Add to this the area's age demographic which leans towards predominently quite old age - next door to the shop is a row of OAP warden attended residences - and you will understand just how unacceptable this proposal is and the negative effect it will have on a good number of council tax paying residents.
