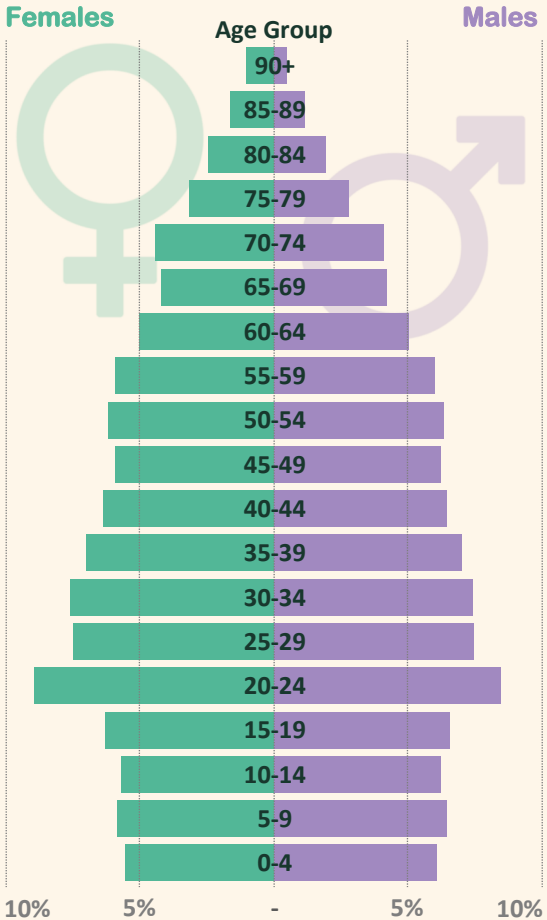

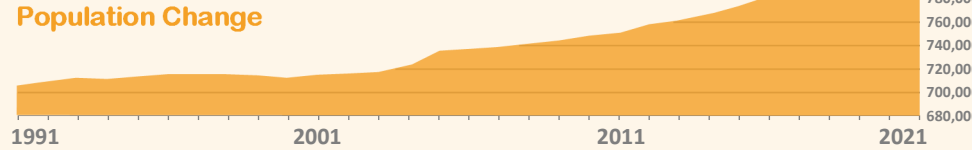

Population by Age and Sex

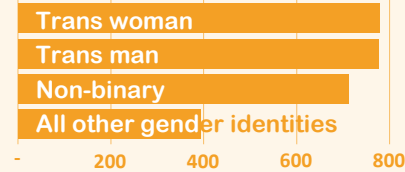
This population pyramid above shows the population of males and females in each five-year age group at the time of the 2021 Census.

The split of the population in Leeds was recorded as a 51.2% female to 48.8% male split in 2021. This shows a slight proportional increase of the female population since the Census 2011. (51.0% female/49.0% male)

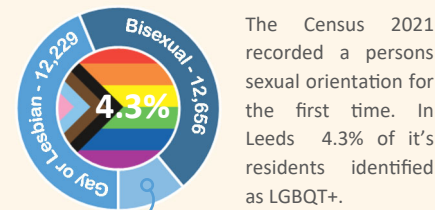


Gender Identity

In Leeds 4,754 people identified as having a different gender identity as their sex when registered at birth?’, more than half of those chose to specify how they identify.



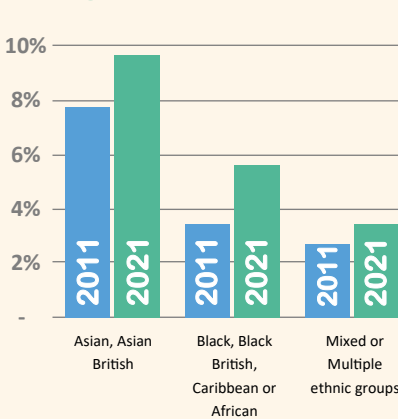
Sexual Orientation



The Census 2021 recorded a persons sexual orientation for the first time. In Leeds 4.3% of it's residents identified as LGBTQ+.

Ethnic Diversity in Leeds

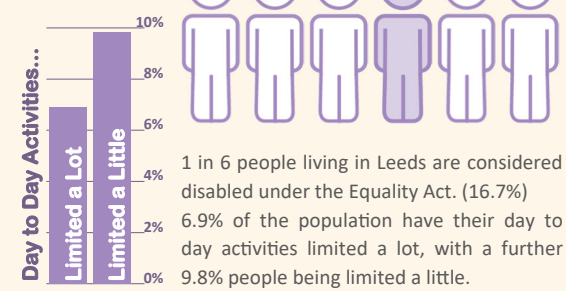
Between the previous two censuses the proportion of people from ethnically diverse communities has risen from 18.9% to 26.6% in Leeds.

In the city the largest broad ethnic group category within the Census 2021 is the 'Asian & Asian British' population, proportionally however, the largest increase in Leeds was the 'Black, Black British, Caribbean or African' group which saw a 75% increase.

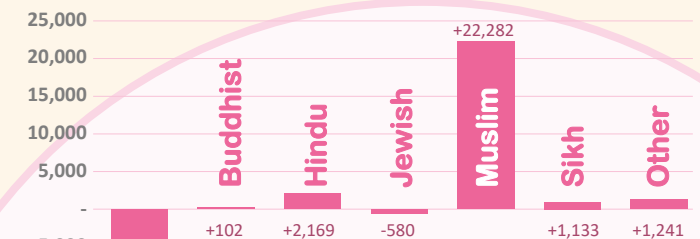
This grid represents the proportions of each major Census Ethnic category in Leeds.

Religion – Change in numbers



People that stated that they have a religion has decreased from 65% of the population in 2011 to 54% in 2021.
