Highway works associated with the proposed student accommodation development at land including 16-22 Burley Street and Park Lane, Leeds, LS3 1LD.			
The highway works comprise the following:			
<ul> <li>Provision of a new loading layby on Burley Street with associated traffic regulation orders, signing and road markings;</li> </ul>			
<ul> <li>Installation of three street trees adjacent to the loading bay. Details of the tree</li> </ul>			

pits to be provided by the developer including root barriers, irrigation systems

and the underground tree cells to be positioned underneath the adopted

footway only.

- Land dedication shown on Preliminary Site Highways Arrangement ref.: J32-7248-PS-001 Rev H to provide a continuous 2m footway along Burley Street and Park Lane;
- Small area of stopping up shown on Preliminary Site Highways Arrangement ref.: J32-7248-PS-001 Rev H to be progressed by the developer under S247 of the T&C Planning Act.
- Reinstatement to footway of the exiting vehicular access on Burley Street;
- Alterations to the existing western kerb radii at the junction between Burley Street and Park Lane including provision of a dropped kerb crossing with tactile paving and a refuge island;
- Reinstatement to footway of existing dropped kerb access on Park Lane;
- No waiting at any time traffic regulation orders along the site frontage on Burley Street.
- All associated civils works, including (inter alia) reconstruction, tie-ins, resurfacing, lighting, signing, drainage and lining works etc;
- Any associated statutory undertakers' works resulting from the works; and
- Any works reasonably required following safety audits of the design and construction of the highway works.

The proposals will improve pedestrian safety by widening and resurfacing the footways along Park Lane and Burley Street.

The proposed enhancements to the existing pedestrian crossing at the junction between Park Lane and Burley Street (i.e. altering the kerb radii at both sides of the junction bellmouth and introducing dropped kerbs, tactile paving, and a refuge island) will promote lower vehicle speeds and improve pedestrian safety when crossing the road at this location.

The proposals also include a loading bay that will serve the deliveries and servicing requirements for the proposed site and any pick-up/drop-offs. No waiting at any time traffic restrictions along the site frontage are also proposed. This will improve highway safety by ensuring delivery, servicing vehicles and taxis have a dedicated area to stop, and implementing no waiting at any time traffic regulation orders to protect the nearby junction and site frontage; therefore, eliminating the risk of vehicles parking near junctions blocking visibility splays and/or pedestrian crossings, and vehicles parking partially and/or fully on footways obstructing pedestrian routes and/or the flow of traffic.

#### Key findings

Positive:

- Dropped kerbs provide level crossing points for older pedestrians, disabled people and people who are pregnant.
- Tactile paving provides a crossing point designed with pedestrians with sight impediments in mind.
- Alterations to the kerb raii at the junction bellmouth between Park Lane and Burley Street will promote vehicles to slow down enhancing highway safety.
- Widened footways will provide adequate pedestrian routes for all users.
- The footways are being resurfaced as part of the offsite highway works. Resurfacing the footway ensures a level footway for disabled users, particularly assisting those in wheelchairs or with sight impediments.
- Introduction of a loading bay and no waiting at any time traffic regulation orders ensures deliveries, servicing vehicles and taxis have a dedicated area to stop avoiding vehicles parking near junctions, pedestrian crossings and/or footways.
- Street trees will enhance the pedestrian environment and provide pedestrians a more pleasant experience while walking.

#### Actions

Actions taken to promote positive impact and remove / reduce negative impact:

- Alterations to the existing junction at Burley Road and Park Lane which will slow down traffic entering and exiting the junction by altering the kerb radii on both sides and enhance pedestrian safety by introducing dropped kerbs, tactile paving and a refuge island.
- Introduction of a new loading bay and no waiting at any time traffic regulation orders which will ensure deliveries, servicing vehicles and taxis have a dedicated area to stop and vehicles do not park near junctions, pedestrian crossings and/or footways.
- Section 106 contributions towards cycling infrastructure along Burley Street have also been secured as part of the development. This will provide segregation infrastructure between vehicles, cyclist and pedestrians and encourage sustainable travel.
