EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1 PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

1.1 Representatives from "Leeds Schools Together" were granted a deputation to the Council on 28 January 2009. The deputation was in opposition to proposals to establish further academies in Leeds, specifically to replace the existing South Leeds High School and Intake High School.

2 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

 - that the issues presented through the deputation were similar to those raised during the consultations on the future of South Leeds and Intake High Schools and presented in detail to the December Executive Board meeting;

1.0 **PURPOSE OF THIS REPORT**

1.1 Representatives from "Leeds Schools Together" were granted a deputation to the Council on 28 January 2009. The deputation was in opposition to proposals to establish further academies in Leeds, specifically to replace the existing South Leeds High School and Intake High School.

2.0 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 Leeds Schools Together is a forum made up of parents, school governors, staff, and professional associations, who collectively oppose proposals for South Leeds and Intake High Schools becoming academies.
- 2.2 The deputation outlined concerns about the consultation process led by Education Leeds and detailed in reports to the December Executive Board meeting; about how judgments are made about the progress these schools are making; about the track record of academies nationally; on the views expressed by staff in Trades Union surveys in the two schools; about the loss of local accountability; and about alternative response the Council might make to respond to perceived government pressure. The deputation restated issues that had been raised in detail during the

consultation. Included at Annex 1 is a record of the speech made to the Council through the deputation.

2.3 Following the decisions of the Executive Board in December 2008 statutory notices were published inviting objections to the proposals. No statutory objections were received. Subsequently the Executive Board in March 2009 decided to confirm the closures of South Leeds and Intake High Schools and their replacement with academies.

3.0 THE MAIN ISSUES

- 3.1 The December Executive Board received a record of the issues raised during the consultations on the future of both South Leeds and Intake High Schools. It also received detailed responses from Education Leeds on all the issues raised.
- The record summarised and grouped issues raised during the consultation under the following main themes;
 - the reasons for further change, and the desire for stability to consolidate following extensive recent change and disruption why an academy?
 - staffing issues; employment rights, staffing structure, pay and conditions, union recognition, the role of the current headteacher.
 - details of the proposed academy; curriculum and specialism, admissions
 policy, exclusions policy, transition arrangements, sixth form. Why and how
 it would be better and improve outcomes for young people and the
 community.
 - the sponsor; their role, funding, plans and background, comparisons with other academy sponsors.
 - governance, accountability, and process issues.
 - financial and miscellaneous matters.
 - the need for new buildings, and the arrangements for design, construction, and transition.

Within each theme a series of specific issues that emerged during the consultation are recorded and a response offered to each.

3.3 Education Leeds made considerable effort to consult relevant stakeholders, record their feedback, and ensure that this was shared publicly and specifically brought to the attention of the Executive Board. The deputation restated issues that had already been brought to the attention of the Executive Board. No statutory objections were received. This is an indication of the nature of the consultation process led by Education Leeds on behalf of the city council.

4.0 **RECOMMENDATIONS**
