- Participation in Police lead operations i.e. Operation Champion or action days
- Participation in Police Tasking meetings aimed at the reduction of crime and anti-social behaviour
- Continued development and promotion of the Young Fire Fighter scheme run through the Leeds District
- Education to target groups delivered through the Arson Task Force and Community Safety Team, delivering education to schools and businesses around fire safety and the prevention of arson.
- Developing links with partner agencies working with Drink and Drug misuse, developing initiatives and activities generating home fire risk checks.
- Safety Rangers run with partners throughout the district, delivering a range of safety messages, not only fire related but other partner messages to school children across the area.

A targeted approach, identifying those most at risk from fire to generate Home Fire Risk Checks has been used to achieve the district target and 15,019 have been completed in since April 2008.

This is supported through identifying projects and partners who work with those most at risk, for example East North East Homes. Training outside agencies who visit people in their own homes in Community Safety awareness and generating referrals for HFRCs.

Other Activities include:

- Support for the Hotspot card scheme, generating referrals through to energy advice and pensions service
- Support the Affordable warmth projects from Leeds City Council
- Encourage the installation of assisted technology equipment and increase the Careline / Telecare referral rate for HFRC
- Delivery of talk to all Leeds schools yr5 pupils per year incorporating both fire and road safety messages.
- Participate in Operation Champion events
- Participation in Police Tasking meetings, identifying hot spot areas and generating initiatives for partnership working.
- Arson prevention work carried out throughout the district.

		Between April and December 2008, there were 7,084 recorded incidents of domestic violence (quarterly figures are adjusted retrospectively to account for slight variance). This is down 1.1% (77 fewer offences) compared with the same period for the previous year. If performance continues at this current rate, the target will not be achieved. A review of police recording processes has been completed and showed that the National Incident Recording Standard had introduced clear guidelines that West Yorkshire Police comply with. This means for example that verbal disputes are no longer classed as a domestic violence without additional supporting evidence; as a result, this has had a small impact on performance. We will continue to work with the Police to understand how reported incidents are being captured, recorded and reported.
