What is an NHS Foundation Trust?

A new type of organisation

A public benefit corporation, similar to mutual building societies and co-operatives

Directly accountable to local people

Membership drawn from the community, patients and staff

Elected Council of Governors

Council of Governors plays an important role in influencing the Board of Directors

New freedoms to reflect local needs and priorities

Local people involved in giving feedback about services

New freedoms from Whitehall

Service development and finance



What does this mean?

Remain part of the NHS family delivering services to national standards

Common inspection and regulation methods

Provide services free at the point of use Based on need not ability to pay

Uphold the values and principles of the NHS
High quality services for everyone

Funded by the NHS


Legally binding contracts with Primary Care Trusts

Foundation Trust Constitution

Constitution sets out legal framework for Foundation Trust:

Membership

Constituencies

Council of Governors

Board of Directors

Elections



Members

Key part of the constitutional change:

Patients, carers or member of staff or public can join (some exclusions)

Participate by giving feedback or taking part in consultations

Vote in elections (or stand as a Governor)

Attend Members events about health

Newsletters and information

Free to join

Council of Governors

21 Public Governors

elected by public Members for 3 years* 5 staff Governors

- elected by staff Members for 3 years*
- 1 NHS Leeds (PCT) appointed by law
- 1 Leeds City Council appointed by law
- 1 Leeds University (medical and dental school)
- appointed by law

We propose to appoint governors from:

- 1 Leeds Metropolitan University
- 1 Leeds Partnerships Foundation Trust
- 1 Leeds Chamber of Commerce
- 1 Voluntary Sector
- 1 Regional Development Agency
- 1 Staff Council (chair)

* Some elected governors will only have a 2 year term of office at the first elections



 - volunteering


Role of the governor

Board of Directors

Non-Executive Directors

Form the majority of Foundation Trust Board posts (including Chairman) role is to generate internal challenge

Chairman


Chairman of the Council of Governors and the Board of Directors, provides leadership across the Trust

Executive Directors

Key roles in NHS Foundation Trusts e.g. Chief Executive, Chief Nurse, Medical Director, Finance Director

Chief Executive

Senior Executive post with responsibility for management of resources, performance management of objectives, quality and safety



How the Foundation Trust will work

Board of Directors

Operationally manage the Trust, finances, services, people etc

Set strategy, plans and budgets

Accept liability

Assess risk

Measure progress

Work alongside Council of Governors



Council of Governors

Appoint Chair and Non-Executive Directors

Appoint Auditors

Receive annual report and accounts

Guide strategic direction and plans

Work alongside Board of Directors



Members

Elect Governors

Stand as Governors

Give community views to and from Governors

Give views about future direction and proposals for change





The Loads Teaching Hospitals NHS

Elections

Independent:

Externally administered elections to ensure fairness and impartiality

Frequency:

Two out of every three years (third year no elections)

Format:

Half of elected governors stand for election each time



Process & Timescale

Oct - Dec 2009

12 week formal public consultation on our governance proposals

Spring 2010


We will respond to feedback given during the 12-week consultation

October 2010

Formal application submitted to the Department of Health

Spring 2011

Earliest date when we could be authorised to become a Foundation Trust
