SUBJECT: Proposal for statutory consultation for changes to primary provision at Horsforth Newlaithes Junior School and Featherbank Infant School in 2011

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

PURPOSE OF THIS REPORT

- 1.0 This report seeks the permission of the Executive Board to consult on two linked proposals for primary expansion in Horsforth for September 2011.
- 2.0 The proposal is to change the age ranges and admissions limits of Horsforth Newlaithes Junior School and Horsforth Featherbank Infant School, to establish them both as all age primary schools (ie age 5-11) from September 2011, to provide 30 extra reception class places.

3.0 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

The Executive Board is asked to approve statutory formal consultation on the linked prescribed alterations to:

i) change the age range of Horsforth Newlaithes Junior School from 7-11 to 5-11, whilst maintaining an admissions limit of 60, with an overall capacity of 420 children; and

ii) change the age range of Horsforth Featherbank Infant School from 5-7 to 5-11, and decrease the admissions number from 60 to 30, with an overall capacity of 210 children.

To note that the consultation on a proposed expansion of Horsforth West End Primary School agreed at December Executive Board will coincide with the two proposals above.

1.0 **PURPOSE OF THIS REPORT**

1.1 This report seeks the permission of the Executive Board to consult on two linked proposals for primary expansion in September 2011.

2.0 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 In December 2009 the Executive Board approved the formal consultation on plans to permanently expand seven primary schools for September 2011, in order to meet continued increasing demand for primary places. As part of the overall plan for 2011 provision a need for an additional 45 places in the Horsforth area was identified. A proposal to expand West End Primary School for 15 of these places has already been agreed by Executive Board for consultation.
- 2.2 Further feasibility work and discussion with the governing bodies of Newlaithes Junior School and Featherbank Infant Schools has taken place and proposals for expansion are outlined in this paper to provide an additional 30 places.
- 2.3 Under the Education and Inspections Act 2006, a change to the age range of a school constitutes a prescribed alteration, which requires a statutory process to confirm the change and make it permanent.

3.0 MAIN ISSUES

- 3.1 A series of informal meetings with heads and chair of governors took place in October 2009. At these meetings the current local context, including the forthcoming 2010 proposals and projected need were discussed.
- 3.2 A range of options for expanding provision between Featherbank Infants and Newlaithes Juniors were identified. Ward members have also been briefed on the options available and this proposal.
- 3.3 Demographic data describing the need for places in the area is contained in Appendix 1. A total of 45 extra receptions places are needed in Horsforth from 2011.
 15 of these have already been considered by Executive Board in December 2009.
- 3.4 The range of options considered has included:

(i) Expand each school as infants and juniors, ie to 90 pupils per year group at each school;

(ii) Creation of a single 3FE through primary on two sites;

(iii) Add one additional infant class per year group and one additional junior class per year group at Newlaithes. That is to have a 2FE infant at Featherbank, and a 1FE infant and 3FE junior school at Newlaithes.

- 3.5 The proposal is to change the age ranges and admissions limits of Horsforth Newlaithes Junior School and Horsforth Featherbank Infant School, to establish them both as all age primary schools (ie age 5-11) from September 2011, to provide 30 extra reception class places.
- 3.6 Initial feasibility studies have identified that both sites are suitable for remodelling and expansion. Detailed building plans will be developed if, following consultation, these proposals proceed and they will be subject to the normal planning permission process.
- 3.7 This proposal would remove separate infant and junior provision in the Horsforth area, enhancing the consistency of the learning environment with risks at transition reduced. The staff and governors at both schools will manage the change process to primary status with the support of Education Leeds. This proposal would enhance the educational outcomes for children in the area.
- 3.8 The schools would be funded appropriately, over time, according to an agreed transition plan.

4.0 **Consultation**

4.1 The proposed consultation will run from 11 January to 26 February 2010. A single consultation document will be produced which describes the proposals for Horsforth in detail, along with the changing demographic context and pupil projections. It will also include details of a transition timetable. This will be made available to all of the schools and communities affected, including pupils, parents and carers, school governors, ward members and other stakeholders. It will include the proposed expansion of West End Primary, detailed in the December 2009 Executive Board report, so that plans for Horsforth as a whole can be considered.

4.2 Meetings will be held for staff, governors, school council, and the public. The document will make clear how anyone can respond during the consultation. It will describe the subsequent processes to be followed and further opportunities to comment prior to a final recommendation which will be considered by the Executive Board in April 2010.

5.0 LEGAL AND RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

5.1 The capital works required to deliver these proposals will be funded through the Education capital programme. The estimated costs of the preferred option is approximately £750k over two financial years. Further reports, seeking financial approval for the fully costed specific schemes will be brought to the Executive Board.

6.0 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

6.1 The Executive Board is asked to approve statutory formal consultation on the linked prescribed alterations to:

i) change the age range of Horsforth Newlaithes Junior School from 7-11 to 5-11, whilst maintaining an admissions limit of 60, with an overall capacity of 420 children; and

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6.2 To note that the consultation on a proposed expansion of Horsforth West End Primary School agreed at December Executive Board will coincide with the two proposals above.
