DPPO signs Armley	LCC Community Safety	In order to assist the enforcement of the Armley Designated Public Places Order (DPPO), posters have been prepared in community languages including Czech, Latvian, Lithuanian, Polish, Russian and Slovak to explain the DPPO rules. Following early efforts to educate people on the DPPO restrictions, the scheme has now moved into an enforcement phase to tackle persistent offenders. In future, the Police will provide figures on numbers of fixed penalty notices issued as the project moves into the enforcement phase.	£1,200.00

I Love West Leeds	ILWL Festival	I Love West Leeds is an annual arts festival rooted in the community of west Leeds. This years festival featured over 40 events spread over 3 weeks. The festival reached over 7500 people not including the hundreds of people who would have seen the Lamppost Gallery which was exhibited on the main streets of Armley, Bramley, Rodley, Farsley and Pudsey. The festival worked with all generations from Primary age (10 primaries took part in projects this year) right through to older people. (over 100 older people attended at live music and tea dance event produced in partnership with the Neighbourhood network schemes). And there was plenty for all ages in between. The festivals first writers in residence scheme saw 5 young writers working hard under the mentorship of professional writer Rommi Smith and Swallow Hill Community College went off curriculum for a whole school day to have their own festival.	£25,000.00
Town Centre Manager	Leeds Ahead	The work of the Town Centre Manager in Armley has included developing a proposal with I Love West Leeds to install 'Art in Unusual Spaces'. The initiative has now taken possession of the former Cooperative on Town Street after seven volunteers worked hard for several days to clean and paint the unit. A rolling four month programme of exhibitions and activities is now developing. A live drawing event took place in mid November where two artists drew Armley as it passed by the unit. The artwork is now displayed in the old co-op and there will be film footage too. Other activities include Christmas craft, a photographic project with shopkeepers on Town Street, an interactive exhibition for young children. The project is being promoted via social networks such as Facebook and Twitter and it is hoped that it will encourage more people to Armley.	£20,000.00
