Executive Summary

This report informs members of an application to vary a Premises Licence for premises situated at Unit 10, Shaftesbury Parade, Harehills Lane, Harehills, Leeds, LS9 6TA trading as Starlight Bar.

The variation application is to extend the hours for the sale of alcohol on Fridays and Saturdays to 11:00hrs to 03:00hrs from the existing hours of 11:00hrs to 23:00hrs.

The hours on Sunday to Thursday to remain as:

Sunday

Noon to 22:30hrs

Monday to Thursday 11:00hrs to 23:00hrs

The premises currently have the following licensable activities:

Sale of Alcohol and Performance of Recorded Music

The application also includes the addition of the following activities on Fridays and Saturdays

Live Music, Provision of Facilities for Making Music, Provision of Facilities for Dancing 21:00 to 03:00 hrs and Late Night Refreshment 23:00 to 03:00hrs

The application also includes seasonal variations for Christmas Eve and New Years Eve for the following activities and hours:

Live Music, Provision of Facilities for Making Music, Provision of Facilities for Dancing, Supply of Alcohol.

Christmas Eve 09:00hrs to 04:00hrs

New Years Eve 09:00hrs to 06:00hrs

Late Night Refreshment 23:00hrs to 03:00hrs on both occasions.

As part of the variation application the applicant proposes to bring back into use an area which had been previously closed due to fire damage.

Purpose of this Report

- 1.1 To advise Members of an application made under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003 ("the Act") to vary a Premises Licence in respect of the above mentioned premises.
- 1.2 Members are required to consider this application due to the receipt to representations

2.0 History of Premises

An application for the conversion of the former Licenses into a Premises Licence was submitted in August 2005 by a Mr Anthony Flynn. No objections to the conversion application were received and a premises licence was duly granted for the existing hours and activities

A variation application was received on the 26th June 2006 the application was for a temporary structural change as a result of a fire on 3rd April 2006 a temporary passage was erected as a thoroughfare between the entrance and a 2nd room.

A licence transfer was received on the 24th August 2010 changing the licence holder from Anthony Flynn to Nawaz Khan

The premises have been subject to an investigation by the Leeds City Council Liaison and Enforcement team due to complaints being received from members of the public. Recent visits have been made to the premises in company with West Yorkshire Police and West Yorkshire Fire and Rescue Services (WYFRS) which have raised concerns regarding noise breakout and fire safety issues. Some of the windows appeared not to fit the frames correctly and cardboard egg cartons have been used in some of the windows as a way to possibly reduce noise photos are attached at **Appendix J**. During the visit WYFRS raised a number of fire safety issues which are contained in an email attached at **Appendix K** for members assistance.

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

- Only individuals licensed by the Security Industry Authority may be used at the premises to guard against:
 - a. unauthorised access or occupation (e.g. through door supervision), or
 - b. outbreaks of disorder, or
 - c. damage
- No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence
 - a. At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b. At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children -

- a. games or activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to
 - i. drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorized to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - ii. drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- b. provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- c. provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- d. provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on
 - i. the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - ii. the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- e. selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by

reason of a disability).

6. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Conditions Effective from 1st October 2010

7. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

- 8. The responsible person shall ensure that
 - a. where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
 - i. beer or cider. 1/2 pint;
 - ii. gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - iii. still wine in a glass:125 ml; and
 - b. customers are made aware of the availability of these measures

Embedded restrictions attached to the licence by virtue of grandfather rights.

- 9. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during the hours stated on this licence and:
 - a. On Christmas Day, 12 noon to 3 p.m. and 7 p.m. to 10.30 p.m.
 - b. On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).
- 10. The above restrictions do not prohibit:
 - a. the taking of the alcohol from the premises, (unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel,) during the first thirty minutes after above hours;
 - b. the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there during the first thirty minutes after the above hours, if the alcohol was supplied for consumption ancillary to those meals.
 - consumption of the alcohol on the premises by, or, the taking, sale or supply of alcohol
 to any person residing in the licensed premises;
 - the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of alcohol so ordered;
 - e. the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
 - f. the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces;

- g. the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- h. the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied;
- i. the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.
- Where the number of children attending the entertainment exceeds 100 the licensee shall ensure that the provisions of Section 12 of the Children and Young Persons Act 1933 are complied with.



It is the opinion of West Yorkshire Police, that your application contains insufficient information on how you would uphold the licensing objectives. In particular, we cannot be satisfied at this stage that, if granted the premises would not adversely affect crime and public nuisance in the locality.

In considering all applications, the police do not only take account of crime and disorder at or inside premises but also in the immediate area that the venue is or is to be located. It is the opinion of West Yorkshire Police that the current situation may be adversely affected, unless matters arising from the premises are not addressed.

Historically The Starlight Bar was synonymous with crime and disorder. The premises were frequently visited by West Yorkshire Police with many fights and scuffles spilling out onto Harehills Lane and the surrounding streets. However, at the time of conversion, the hours the premises were permitted to open, were significantly reduced and following a fire on 3rd April 2006 the premises were temporarily closed. The operator at this time did reopen the premises following the fire, but a temporary structure was erected around the fire damaged area to allow the premises to continue to trade. This area accounted for approximately fifty percent of the floor space.

The premises have been closed off and on for some time. Leeds City Council, West Yorkshire Police and other Responsible Authorities did receive an application in 2009 to licence the premises as Byblos Night Club, but following a number of representations this application was withdrawn.

This application is to vary the existing premises licence for The Starlight Bar. The Premises Licence Holder (PLH) has changed, although the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) remains the same.

In August 2010 the premises licence changed into your name. Within a very short space of time intelligence was received to suggest that The Starlight Bar was operating again, but was operating beyond its existing hours.

On Sunday 19 September 2010 Officers from Leeds City Council witnessed noise breakout from the premises at 0100hrs when the premises appear to have been operating beyond their permitted hours. A copy of their warning letter is attached to this letter of representation for ease of reference.

On 24 September 2010 Officers from the Neighbourhood Policing Team (NPT) visited the premises and spoke to a male who identified himself to Officers as 'the owner'. Officers were told that the premises were not open to the public and he and 'his partner' would be applying for the appropriate licences and would speak to Leeds City Council. Officers were also told that there were no plans to open the venue as a nightclub and it was their intention to run the premises as a 'sports hall' with pool tables. The person spoken to said the loud music was due to the builders working during the evenings and nights, but made no apologies for this.

On 7 October 2010 Officers from Leeds City Council, West Yorkshire Police and West Yorkshire Fire visited the premises and met you. At the time of the visit a number of builders were on site and you had employed an independent fire assessor to inspect the premises. The partition wall which had been erected after the fire in 2006 had been removed. The windows were open and some would not close and were hanging off their hinges. It was clear that work was ongoing and there was still a lot to do.

West Yorkshire Fire spoke independently to the fire assessor but made it very clear to you that there was work that needed to be done on the premises and it was important to have early sight of the fire risk assessment.

Officers referred to your 'business partner' following the visit by NPT Officers on 24 September 2010. You said that you did not have a 'business partner', but a man you described as an Eastern European man was interested in the business. When pressed further on this point and asked for this persons details you would not provide these saying that you did not have a 'business partner' it was just someone who had shown some interest in the business! It was made very clear at this meeting that the premises should not operate outside the licence already in place. Temporary Event Notices (TENs) were discussed and the procedure to apply for a TEN was explained.

Whilst at the premises a very basic boxed CCTV system was seen on one of the tables. You were asked if it was his intention to install this system in the premises. WYP and LCC were advised that it was your intention; You were told that the system would not give the coverage required and you would do better to return the system to the shop and wait for WYP to conduct a full CCTV inspection.

Upon leaving the premises Officers were passed in the doorway by two males, who appeared to be of Eastern European origin. Further enquiries have been conducted in relation to the males and links have been established to known premises and individuals from Police systems.

On 25 November 2010 a follow up visit was made to the premises by West Yorkshire Police, Leeds City Council and West Yorkshire Fire. You were unable to meet us at the premises but we were met by Mr Honor Rafik, who described himself as your 'business partner'. Mr Rafik was asked for the fire risk assessment, which he could not produce and was not aware of the discussion that had taken place on the earlier visit. It was made very clear how important this document was, but a brief inspection of the premises showed that a number of the earlier identified issues had not been rectified. We were again promised that these matters would be addressed as soon as possible.

The CCTV system which Officers had seen on their earlier visit had been installed and not returned to the shop. The system only has four cameras and upon inspection one camera was not working. The coverage is inadequate for the size of the premises and nobody could use the system properly. I did inform Mr Rafik that you had been advised to return the equipment and await a full inspection by WYP. Mr Rafik was not aware of this and he had purchased the system out of his own money. The system is not fit for purpose.

Officers from WYP, LCC and WYFire arranged to revisit the premises after one week to see if the work required, to make the premises safe and useable, had been carried out. You phoned prior to the visit to

say you were too busy to meet. I tried to recontact you but your phone was switched off. It has not been possible to reschedule the meeting or inspect the premises further.

Since this time information has been received from HMRC in relation to Mr Rafik. He is described by HMRC as a 'repeat' cigarette and tobacco offender. He is linked to a store in Harehills where seizures of illicit cigarettes and tobacco have been made at least 8 times within the last 18 months. These seizures range from 2000 – 120000 illicit cigarettes and 2Kg – 30Kg of illicit tobacco. HMRC fear that if the licence is granted for The Starlight Bar then Mr Rafik and any associates will have a further outlet for their 'business'.

On 3 December 2010 Officers visited the Starlight Bar to carry out a check on the premises. Upon arrival Officers found the building to be insecure, and entered and searched the property to ensure it was all in order. The premises were in darkness the property appeared to being renovated and there were several power tools as well as bottles of alcohol inside. Whoever had been working on the premises had left in a hurry leaving the premises insecure. Arrangements were made to secure the premises.

Whilst a Leeds City Council Risk Assessment Pro-forma has been completed and does accompany this application, we would ask any sub-committee to refuse this application outright. The premises have operated beyond their existing hours under the authorisation of TENs but this has not been straightforward. You have not sufficiently demonstrated how you will uphold the licensing objectives. WYP, LCC and WYFire have seen little evidence of engagement prior to any licence being granted, at a time when the premises should be doing everything in their power to engage and address the issues highlighted to them.

FOR THE REASONS SET OUT ABOVE WEST YORKSHIRE POLICE ARE OF THE OPINION THAT THIS APPLICATION SHOULD BE REFUSED IN FULL.

WEST YORKSHIRE POLICE DEEM THIS OBJECTION RELEVANT, PROPORTIONATE AND NECESSARY IN ORDER TO PROMOTE THE LICENSING OBJECTIVES.

We are in receipt of complaints that the above mentioned premises are operating beyond their permitted hours without the benefit of an authorisation. The complainants allege that the premises are undertaking unauthorised licensable activities up to 5am.

On Sunday 19th September 2010 at 01.00am officers from Leeds City Council's Licensing Enforcement section witnessed loud music emanating from your premises. Also witnessed was a male operating the shutter door on the main entrance as a way to block the entrance/exit.

On the basis of information received the evidence points to the fact that certain offences may have been committed by you and/or others under Section 136 of the Licensing Act 2003, in that (1) a person commits an offence if (a) he carries on or attempts to carry on a licensable activity on or from any premises otherwise than in accordance with an authorisation, or (b) he knowingly allows a licensable activity to be carried on.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind you of your current opening hours and your current licensable hours and activity.

Opening Hours of the Premises:

Monday to Saturday 11.00hrs (11am) until 23.00hrs (11pm) Sunday 12.00hrs (midday) until 22.30hrs (10.30pm)

I would again like to advise you that it is an offence to carry out licensable activities without the appropriate Authorisation being in place, contrary to the Licensing Act 2003, CH. 17, Section 136 (1) (a) (b).

All unauthorised licensable activities after 11.00pm should cease with immediate effect. Failure to do so could result in this Section recommending that legal proceedings be instigated against you by the Council's Legal Department. Unlicensed activity can, on summary conviction, attract a fine of up to £20,000 and/or six months imprisonment.

As a result of the complaints mentioned above I have arranged with both West Yorkshire Police and West Yorkshire Fire and Rescue to attend your premises to carry out a full licence inspection.

An inspection date has been appointed for **Tuesday 28th September 14.00hrs (2.00pm)**. If this time and date is inconvenient, or you have any other queries, please do not hesitate to contact me on the above mentioned telephone number.

I must advise you that your premises will be monitored for compliance by Leeds City Council Enforcement Officers.



Regarding our meeting a Starlight Bar I was unable to conduct a Fire Safety Audit as the Responsible Person did not have his Fire Risk Assessment. I would expect the risk assessment to cover the following, which was discussed with Mr Rafik:

The premises has two directions of escape and the two staircases are separate from one another, however some work will be required to make one of these stairs into a protected stair. The main concern is that the exit width of the final exits will limit the occupancy to 100 people. Mr Rafik stated that at the last event there were only 60 people present. Mr Rafik has agreed to change the style of the main entrance door to give a larger exit width and fix the alternative exit door to allow both sides of the double door to openimmediately without having to open a catch. Mr Rafik stated thathe was aware that no more than 100 people can be in the premises and did not intend for this to happen until the exit widths had been widened.

There is some emergency lighting within the stair, however the primarylighting has been disconnected; Mr Rafik has agreed to have thisreinstated immediately. There is also a large amount of combustible materialleading onto the staircase which Mr Rafik stated was theretemporarily and would be removed as soon as possible.

There are a number of other fire safety concerns detailed below; I willneed to see the risk assessment to determine if these areas have been identified and suitable time scales put in place:

- * Fire detection may need extending to the cellar as a fire in this areacould go unnoticed and affect the means of escape.
- * The alternative escape stair needs making up to be 30 minute fire resistant as it currentlyopens into storage areas and there are gaps leading into the cellar.
- * Further maintained emergency lighting required at storey exits and finalexits, Photoluminescent signs have been provided as an interimmeasure.

A full audit will be required to determine if there are any other areasof deficiency particularly in relation to management and fire safetyarrangements; this could not be done at this time as Mr Rafik didnot have all the relevant information. Follow up visit to be arranged



Thank you for submitting your application dated 10th November 2010 for a variation of licence for the above premises.

The application premises consist of a former Shaftsbury Cinema which is situated on the junction of York Road and Harehills Lane, Leeds 9. The ground floor of the building has been converted into retails units and the upper floor level is used as a licensed bar known as Starlight Bar. There are several open able windows (some of them with ill-fitting frames) facing Harehills Lane. The premises is not air conditioned, therefore the windows will be relied upon for ventilation during the summer. There is also a roof vent which may not be acoustically treated to prevent amplified noise breaking out from the premises.

Immediately to the rear of the site is a Job Centre and diagonally opposite (some 30 metres away) on Harehills Lane is a parade of six shops with residential accommodation above. Immediately beyond to the rear of the shops is a densely populated residential area. Further residential flats are situated some 100 metres to the north of the site along Harehills Lane.

Existing Opening Times

It is not known if the opening hours of the premises have been restricted by the Council's Planning Services. However, I understand that the current opening hours of the premises are as follows:

Monday - Sunday: 11:00 hours - 23:00 hours.

Proposed Opening Times

The applicant is now seeking to extend the opening hours as follows:

Sunday - Thursday: no change.

Friday & Saturdays only: 11:00 hours – 4:30 hours.

Noise complaints

The Department has recently received a noise complaint made by a nearby resident to the Council's Licensing Section regarding loud music being played at the premises which has caused a sleep disturbance. The complaint was made as a result noise breaking out from an event which was held on Sunday the 21st November 2010 at 1.00am. The event was permitted under the Temporary Event Notice. The complainant in question has indicated that although other residents in the area have been affected by the noise, however, due to fear of reprisals they do not wish to make complaints to the Council. I understand that some local residents have also objected to this application.

<u>Implications for noise disturbance arising from the proposed variation of the Premises</u> <u>Licence</u>

The operating hours applied for has the potential to cause noise disturbance from comings and goings of the customers, customers congregating outside the premises to smoke and in the nearby streets.

There is no dedicated car park or parking spaces available for the patrons close to the application premises, most of the vehicles will be parked in the neighbouring residential streets which will result in noise disturbance from arrival and departure of cars, the slamming of car doors, revving of engines, sounding horns, and loud use of car stereos. The possible noise problems from the above-mentioned sources of noise will be exacerbated especially during the summertime as the nearby residents will have their windows open for ventilation purposes. The Environmental Health has no enforcement powers to deal with the noises associated with the customers' vehicles or customers causing noise disturbance in the nearby residential streets.

Health and Environmental Action Service is concerned about the proposed live music on the premises as it is less controllable than the recorded music. Some of the musical instruments associated with live music are non electronic and, therefore cannot be connected to sound level regulatory devices (noise limiters) to control the noise. Furthermore live music is often accompanied by patrons cheering, shouting and clapping which have the potential to cause noise disturbance to the nearby residents.

The proposed variation of the premises licence represents a major change to the operation of this licensed premises, which is likely to be detrimental to those living in the vicinity. In view of these concerns, Leeds City Council's Health and Environmental Action Service (HEAS) fully objects to this application as it will generate further noise nuisance complaints from the nearby residents and, therefore would undermine the prevention of public nuisance objective of the Licensing Act 2003.

However, should the Licensing sub-committee be minded to grant the variation of the premises licence, it is recommended that the licensing sub-committee should have regard to the following licensing conditions being imposed to this licence:

Noise and Vibration

- Licensable activities shall be conducted and the facilities for licensed activities shall be designed and operated so as to prevent the transmission of audible noise or perceptible vibration through the fabric of the building or structure to adjoining properties.
- Noise from a licensable activity at the premises shall be inaudible at the nearest noise sensitive premises at all times.
- Ensure all doors and windows are kept closed to reduce noise nuisance from the premises when regulated entertainment takes place.
- 4. There shall be no external loudspeakers.
- 5. The smokers shall only be allowed to use the external area nearest to the York Road.
- Bottles will not be placed in any external receptacle after 11 pm to minimise noise disturbance to neighbouring properties.
- 7. Noise from plant or machinery shall be inaudible at the nearest noise sensitive premises during the operation of the plant or machinery. Plant and machinery shall be regularly serviced and maintained to meet this level.
- 8. The PLH/DPS will adopt a "cooling down" period where music volume is reduced towards the closing time of the premises.

Litter

9. The PLH/DPS shall ensure that litter arising from people using the premises is cleared away regularly and that promotional materials such as flyers do not create litter.

Transport / Pedestrian Movement

- 10. Clear and legible notices will be displayed at exits and other circulatory areas requesting patrons to leave the premises quietly having regard to the needs of local residents, in particular emphasising the need to refrain from shouting, slamming car doors, sounding horns and loud use of vehicle stereos and anti-social behaviour.
- 11. The designated premises supervisor and any door supervisors will monitor the activity of persons leaving the premises and remind them of their public responsibilities where necessary.
- 12. SIA registered door staff will be employed and used where queues are likely to form to manage the queues and ensure that queues are restricted to cordoned areas to prevent them obstructing footpaths and spilling out onto roads, and to keep noise and obstructions away from residential property.
- 13.A facility will be provided for customers to order hackney taxis/private hire vehicles. Telephone numbers for taxi firms/private hire companies will be displayed in a prominent position on the premises.

The adjoining premises at Southern House, 529 York Road, Leeds LS9 6TF is occupied by the Secretary of State for Communities & Local Government (the "DWP") and operates as a Job Centre with ancillary functions. Telereal Trillium act on their behalf and we write in connection to the licensing application setting out our opposition to the proposals and would ask that our comments and involvement as DWP's representatives be suitably registered.

We and DWP are chiefly concerned that there would be the potential for an increase in incidents concerning people under the influence of alcohol within the Jobcentre. Due to the nature of the business undertaken at Southern House, security of staff is of paramount importance.

Without prejudice to the demographic profile of patrons visiting Starlight Bar, it is a concern to DWP that the walkway will become seriously littered with rubbish, vomit, urine etc. and it is unlikely that there will be anyone from the club cleaning up in the early hours. 





Samantha,

Regarding our meeting a Starlight Bar I was unable to conduct a Fire Safety Audit as the Responsible Person did not have his Fire Risk Assessment. I would expect the risk assessment to cover the following, which was discussed with Mr Rafik:

The premises has two directions of escape and the two staircases areseparate from one another, however some work will be required to make one ofthese stairs into a protected stair. The main concern is that the exit width ofthe final exits will limit the occupancy to 100 people. Mr Rafik statedthat at the last event there were only 60 people present. Mr Rafik has agreed to changethe style of the main entrance door to give a larger exit width and fix thealternative exit door to allow both sides of the double door to openimmediately without having to open a catch. Mr Rafik stated thathe was aware that no more than 100 people can be in the premises and did notintend for this to happen until the exit widths had been widened.

There is some emergency lighting within the stair, however the primarylighting has been disconnected; Mr Rafik has agreed to have thisreinstated immediately. There is also a large amount of combustible materialleading onto the staircase which Mr Rafik stated was theretemporarily and would be removed as soon as possible.

There are a number of other fire safety concerns detailed below; I willneed to see the risk assessment to determine if these areas have beenidentified and suitable time scales put in place:

Fire detection may need extending to the cellar as a fire in this areacould go unnoticed and affect the means of escape.

The alternative escape stair needs making up to be 30 minute

fire resistant as it currentlyopens into storage areas and there are gaps leading into the cellar.

Further maintained emergency lighting required at storey exits

and finalexits, Photoluminescent signs have been provided as an interimmeasure.

A full audit will be required to determine if there are any other areasof deficiency particularly in relation to management and fire safetyarrangements; this could not be done at this time as Mr Rafik didnot have all the relevant information. Follow up visit to be arranged
