Summary of main issues

- Embrace is the United Kingdom's first combined infant and children's transport service. It undertakes neonatal transfers alongside paediatric retrievals for the 23 hospitals across Yorkshire and the Humber; serving four tertiary neonatal units and two paediatric intensive care units. Established in a phased approach from December 2009, Embrace undertook just over 2000 transfers in its first full year of operation
- Attached, for consideration by the Joint Health Overview and Scrutiny Committee (HOSC), is an impact assessment on the regional infant and children's transport service produced by Embrace. Appropriate representatives have been invited to attend the meeting to present the attached impact assessment and address any questions from the Committee.
