RE: Licensing Act 2003 – Application for the Variation of Club Premises Certificate : Licence Number: CPREM/222/V02 Premises: Adrian Social Club 1a Belle Vue Avenue Leeds LS8 2NN

I would like to object to the above application under the following criteria under the Licensing Act 2003:-

- The Prevention of Public Nuisance

I have two concerns in relation to the licence variation, specifically:-

1) Live Music, Dance

Namely, the extension of time the licence allows the activity. From:- 23:00 (Mon-Sat) / 22:30 (Sun) To:- 23:59 (Every Day)

1.1) I have no objection to live music being played at the Social Club, however, I do object that it is played to a time that I would consider both unsociable & unreasonable i.e. 23:59. This is especially relevant as:-

1.1.1) The club is located within a residential area

1.1.2) The extension is being applied for Every Day making getting up early to go to work and school is made difficult due to disruptive sleep

1.1.3) During the summer when the door at the side of the club is opened for increased ventilation. The stage used for the live performers is directly in front of this door and the music can be heard *directly* into our bedroom less than 25 metres away

2) Sale by Retail of Alcohol

Namely, the extension of time the licence allows the activity. From:- 23:00 (Mon-Fri) / 00:30 (Sat) / 22:30 (Sun) To:- 01:00 (Every Day)

2.1) Again, I have no objection to people drinking alcohol in the club until a reasonable hour i.e. current licensing hours. However, I do object that due to the proposed extension of hours, there will be people leaving the club well after 01:00 in the morning - a time I would consider both unsociable & unreasonable. As you may imagine, the noise generated at this point is not insignificant i.e. continued conversations & shouts of "goodnight" across the car park, vehicles driven off the car park, etc. This is especially relevant as:-

2.1.1) The club is located within a residential area

2.1.2) The extension is being applied for Every Day making getting up early to go to work and school is made difficult due to disruptive sleep

2.1.3) When the club closes, staff go out to the club backyard and throw the empty bottles from the evening into a container which makes an incredibly loud noise

Please accept this email as a representation to the above variation of Club Premises Certificate. If this is not considered to be valid, I would be grateful if you could let me know as soon as possible including an explanation of why the representation cannot be accepted.
