### Summary of main issues

- 1. At its meeting on the 20<sup>th</sup> of June 2012 the Scrutiny Board resolved to undertake an Inquiry into Private Fostering due to concern that long term private foster care arrangements could be in place without the knowledge of the Local Authority. This presented a number of associated concerns including child exploitation, trafficking and a potential lack of support and care arrangements for both the child and the carer. The Board determined that it would consider how private foster care arrangements are identified, the regulation of private foster carers and how privately fostered children and young people are kept safe and protected.
- 2. The Scrutiny Board has now completed its inquiry. The report will be provided as late supplementary information prior to the Scrutiny Board meeting on the 17<sup>th</sup> of January 2013.
