### 1 Purpose of this report

1.1 The purpose of this report is to present an update on progress and the implications of current NHS Trusts in Leeds working towards and achieving Foundation Trust status.

# 2 Background

- 2.1 At its meeting on 21 June 2013, a number of potential topics/ work programme areas were highlighted and discussed as potential matters for the work programme. At that meeting the Scrutiny Board (Health and Wellbeing and Adult Social Care) identified the following themes to form the broad direction of the its work programme for 2013/14:
  - Narrowing the Gap;
  - Service quality;
  - Urgent and emergency care;
  - Progress / implications associated with achieving NHS Foundation Trust status;
  - Information flows/ data sharing
- 2.2 Following the previous Scrutiny Board meeting, in relation to progress / implications associated with achieving NHS Foundation Trust status, relevant organisations were invited to attend the July meeting to outline its plans, progress, implications and general trajectory associated with achieving NHS Foundation Trust status.
- 2.3 As such, the purpose of this report is to present an update on progress and the implications of current NHS Trusts in Leeds working towards and achieving Foundation Trust status.

### 3 Main issues

- 3.1 Currently, Leeds and York Partnership NHS Foundation Trust is the sole NHS Foundation Trust in Leeds, with Leeds Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust (LTHT) and Leeds Community Healthcare NHS Trust (LCH) working towards achieving NHS Foundation Trust status.
- 3.2 As part of the overall changes to the NHS structure, arising from the Health and Social Care Act 2012, the closure of strategic health authorities and the introduction of the NHS Trust Development Authority (NTDA) saw the authorisation process to become a foundation trust change from 1 April 2013.
- 3.3 In addition to general progress of local NHS Trust working towards achieving foundation trust status, this report seeks to provide an overview of the role and function of the NTDA and the foundation trust authorisation process. As such, the following information is appended to this report:
